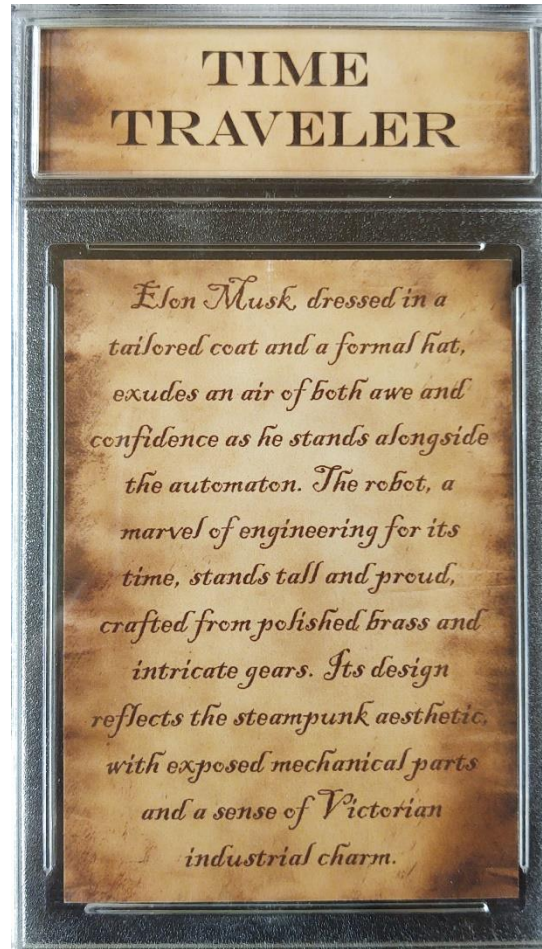

## A Carte de Visite Vision of Modern Genius

Artists express skills through Art Cards Editions and Originals (AECO) cards. Some are one off creations and others are part of a numbered series, however each is considered a unique work of art.

While many AECO cards are generally low in value this Elon Musk / Time Traveler card has established a unique place in modern collectible Ephemera in a short time as a one-of-a-kind piece of modern art.

Created in the carte de visite style of the mid to late 19th century it depicts the Tesla, SpaceX, xAI owner Elon R. Musk, engineer, businessman, technological visionary, and richest man in the world with over \$250B US at the time of this writing standing with an automaton robot, unrealized technology until 1948.

As one collector said while he examined the card, "Musk has a stoic almost I told you I could build it look on his face and the visibly proud posture of a creator".

The card seems to capture a rare moment of genius, innovation and Victorian style. Created on the 1st of July, 2023 this card caught the eye of a major collector and after being secured for the collection it began to attract the interest and offers of other Ephemera collectors until it's value has progressed north of one hundred times the original investment.

Sometimes fate totally hits a homerun without intent.

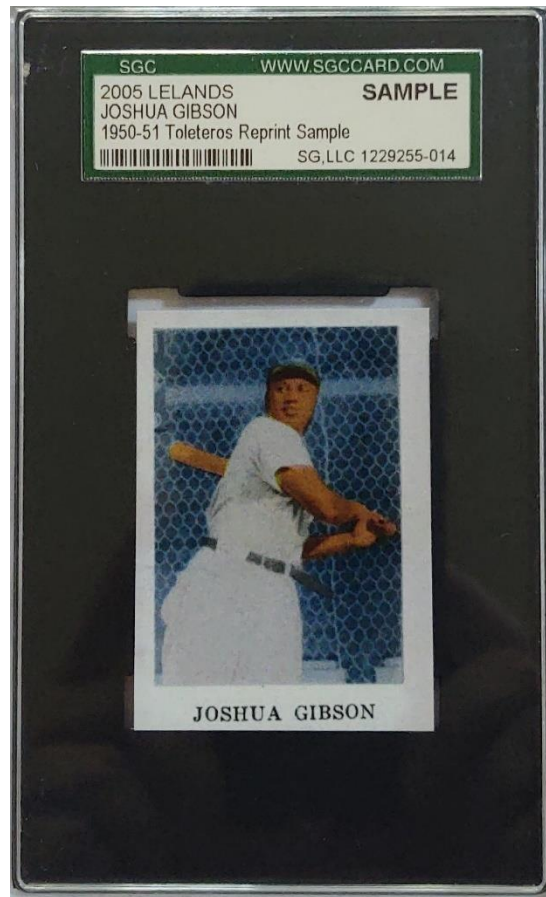
Like Musk, this card is an exceptional singularity that will likely never exist again in such an impactful form.

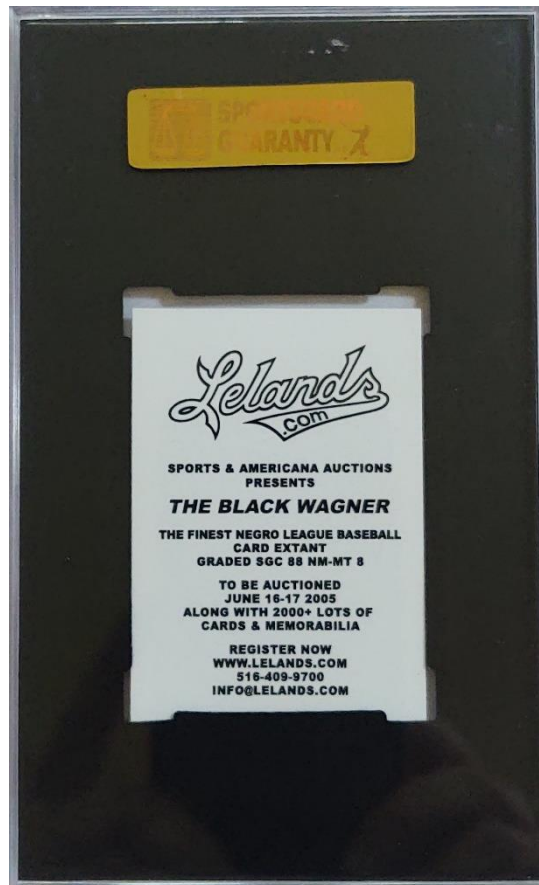

Joshua "Josh" Gibson began his career in the 1930 Negro leagues at the age of 18 and played until 1946. He spent his career behind the plate as a catcher and many believe he was the best catcher of all time in any league. Record keeping at that time in those leagues was sporadic due to exhibition and short games, but it is also considered that Gibson may have been one of the greatest hitters ever to play the game of baseball.

His homerun count is thought to be between 165 and 239, but some think he may have hit as many as 600 - 800 homeruns with a .366 average that rivaled Ty Cobb.

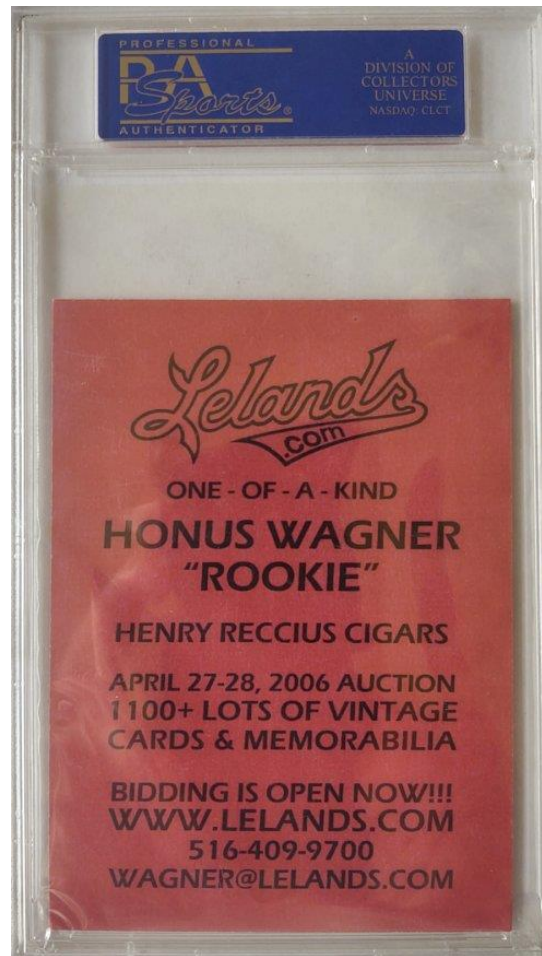
There is only one baseball card of Josh Gibson, the 1950-51 Toleteros and good quality copies go for \$50,000 or more. Leland's created a reprint during the 2005 auction of one of these cards. The Joshua Gibson 1950-51 Toleteros Reprint isn't as scarce or costly as the 2006 Honus Wagner Reccius reprint, but it still represents one of the rarest cards in the world.

## The Rarest Grail Card of All - 1897-1899

Almost anyone in the baseball card collecting world knows the 1909 Honus Wagner T206 card that sells for millions whenever one comes up for auction.

But there is one Honus Wagner card that is even rarer and yet many collectors likely don't know about it and wouldn't recognize it if seen.

While Honus Wagner was playing in his early days with the Louisville Colonels, Henry Reccius used his name and image on several brands of cigar products from his Louisville, Kentucky based tobacco company.

The advertising logo on the original card stated:

"Henry Reccius, Manufacturer of Hans Wagner--10c Cigar" and "Koda Bowler Our Favorite Farmers' and Gardeners' Favorite 5c Cigars."

Only two of these cards are known with both graded by Professional Sports Authenticator (PSA).

One of the cards came up for auction in 2006 and Leland's created a special reprint to commemorate the auction of this unique PSA 1 graded card.

The original card is 3 3/8 by 4 3/4 inches in size and sold in 2006 for \$52,039.60 to a collector.

The card shown is one of the few PSA graded versions of that special auction promo reprint found today.

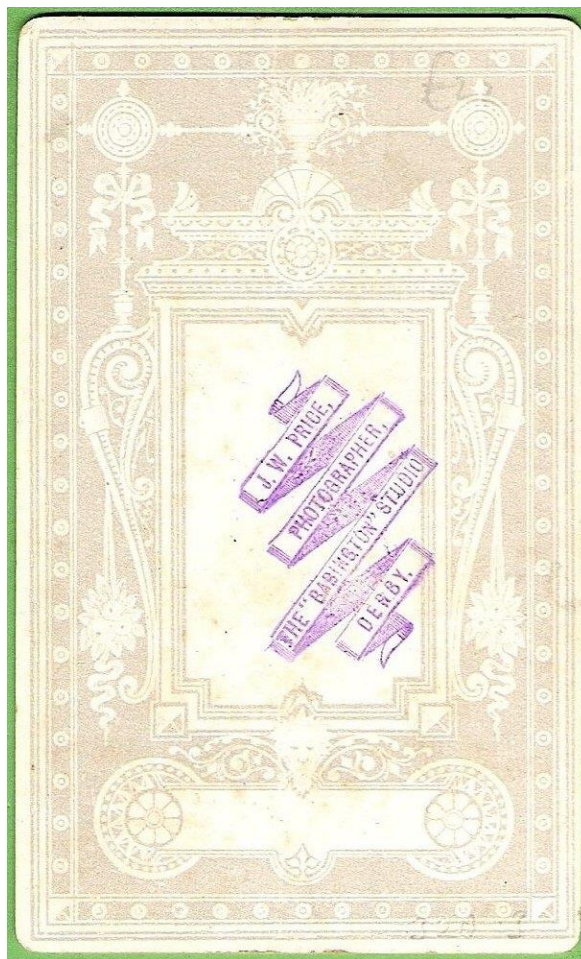
## Rare Cards – Fred Spofforth – The Demon Bowler

Born September 9, 1853, Frederick Robert Spofforth took two wickets playing for New South Wales against W.G. Grace at the age of 18. He was said to be the bowler who had the measure of Grace. He played his first Test in 1877 and rose to fame on 27 May 1878, when he bowled Grace for a duck and brazenly dispatched the MCC at Lord's.

Known as "The Demon Bowler" his ferocious fast bowling allowed him to be the first take 50 Test wickets and to take a Hat Trick three men in a row on three deliveries in 1879. On 29 August 1882, Spofforth became legend by rallying the Aussies in the match that gave birth to the Ashes by holding England from 85 runs. He has been considered the best bowler of all.

### The Smiling Demon

As Fred Spofforth aged into the 1880's he became known for his thick moustache and fearsome glaring demonic like stare.

During a cricket trip to England in 1884 he met Phyllis Cadman and married her in Broadsall, Derbyshire. He returned with his new wife to Australia, but in 1888 relocated back to Derbyshire.

He became the Managing Director of his wife's family business the well-known Star Tea Company and after a pause he played cricket for the Derbyshire Cricket Club.

This Carte de Viste (CDV) picture was taken in the 39 Babington Lane, Derbyshire studio of J.W. Price and shows a semi-smiling lanky 6'3" Spofforth with his trademark moustache growing in.

It was likely taken shortly after the circa 1880 CDV above on file in the Australian Sports Museum. This CDV was taken back to Australia and appears to have been gifted later to a third party. It is likely Spofforth himself carried it halfway across the world.

These vintage CDV photos can be considered Spofforth's rookie cricket cards, as most were single original CDVs without copies which makes them invaluable museum grade Ephemera.

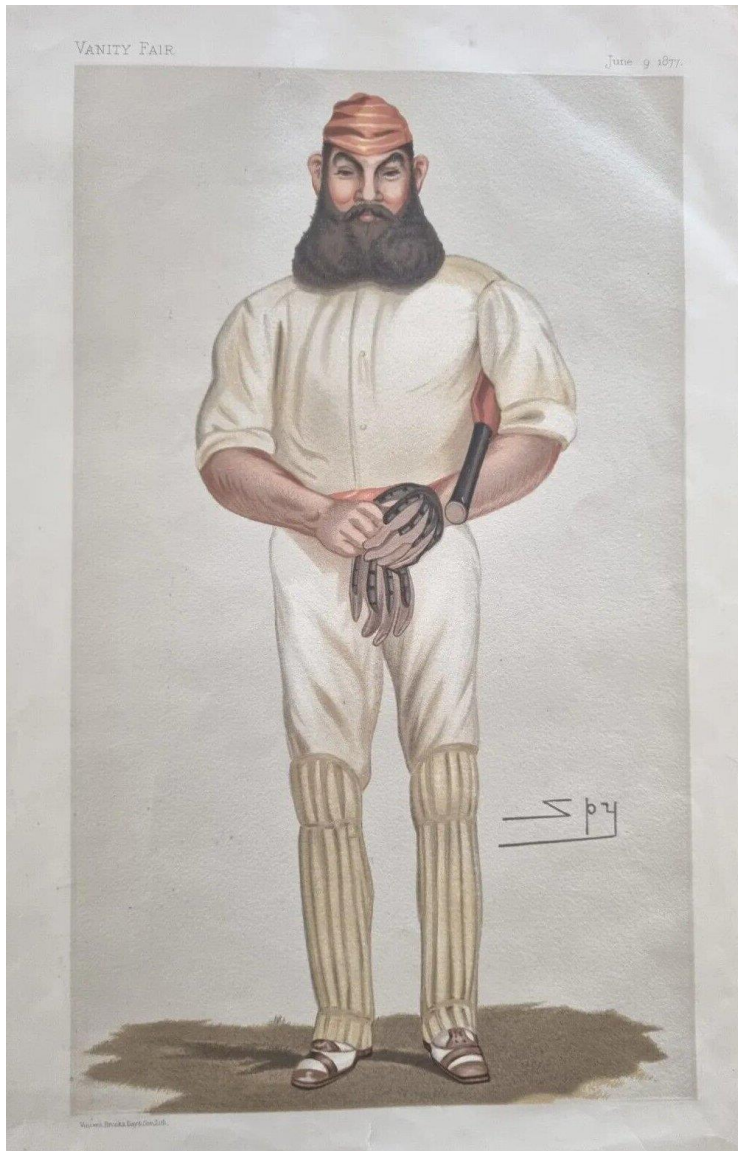
Spofforth had played against Duffield which was just 5- 6 miles from Derbyshire as recorded in this obscure news article.

### South Australian Chronicle Sat. 27 Oct. 1894

This is the first time, I believe, that an English eleven will have visited the Modern Athens, but I well remember a match which the **local players ventured against an Australian eleven at Duffield paddocks. The demon Spofforth** was deadly in more respects than one. His opponents not only went down before him like chaff before the wind, but he splintered three stumps in one innings.

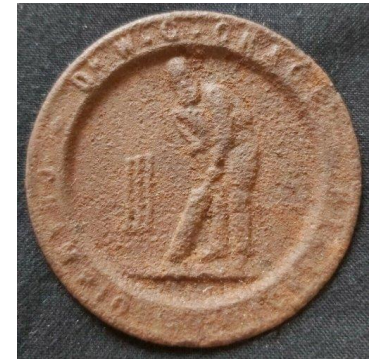

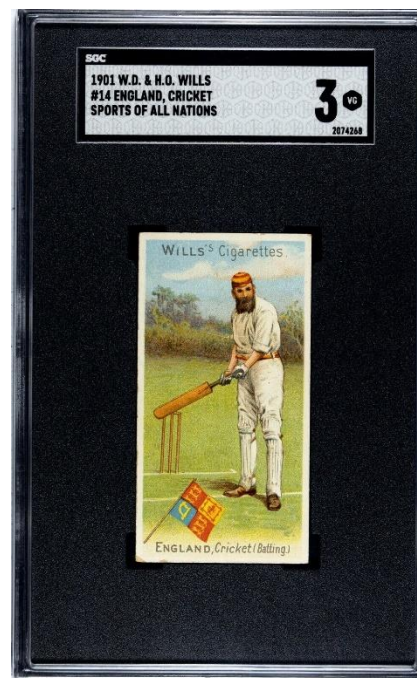

William Gilbert Grace MRCS LRCP, considered the greatest amateur cricket player in England was born on July 18, 1848. He was instrumental in the development and good at all aspects of the game but dominated play during the era scoring a reported 54,000+ first-class runs over his 44-year career. Although listed as an amateur from 1865-1908, Grace did make quite an income from his cricket play.

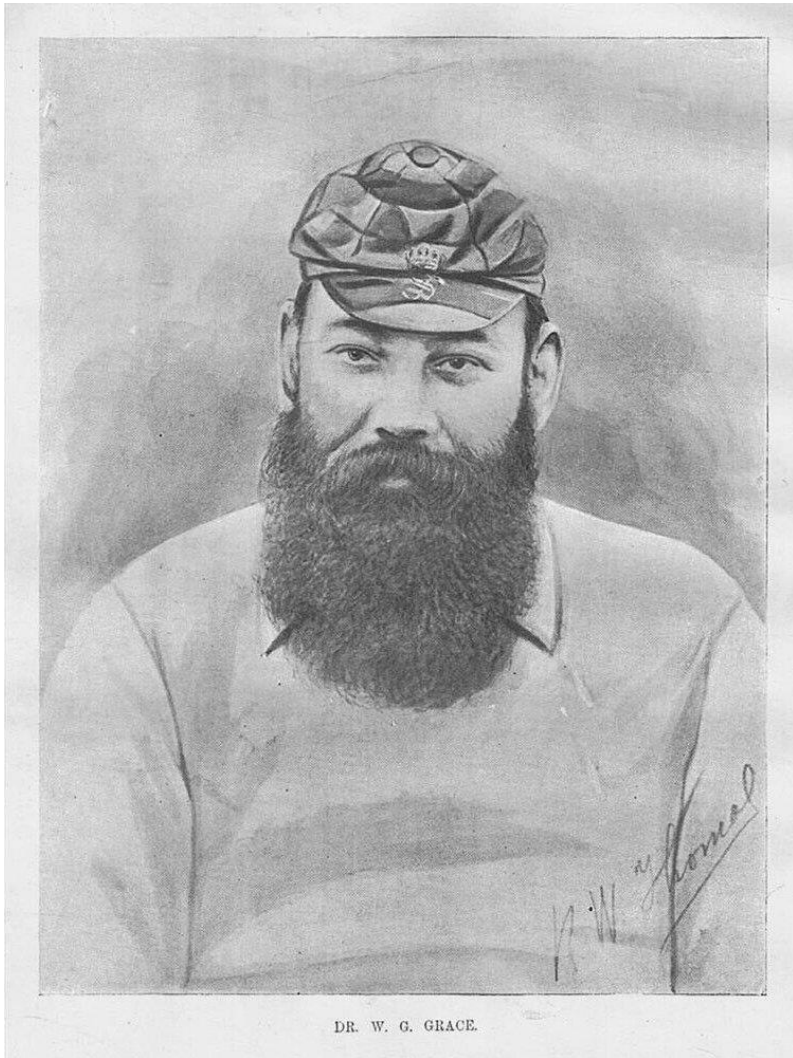
Grace played for 29 teams, was a certified medical practitioner and a pioneer in the game of cricket.



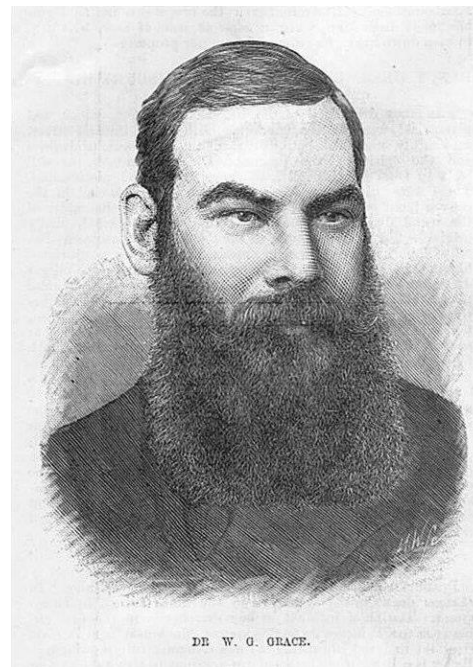

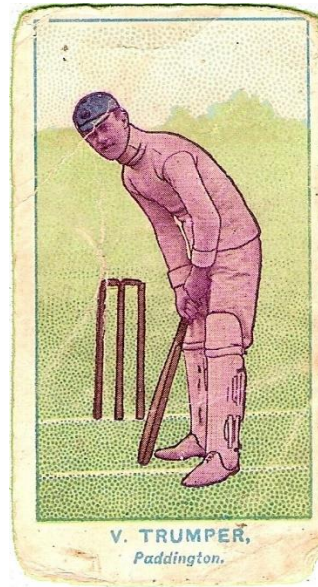

## The Batting Genius of Golden Age Cricket

Born in Sidney in 1877, the young Victor Trumper was selected at the age of 17 to play cricket for New South Wales.

In 1899, in only his second career Test he scored 135 runs and then scored 300 not out against Sussex. Trumper played against England in 1899, 1902, 1905 and 1909.

In 1910/11 when South Africa visited Australia, Victor scored 662 in five Tests for an average of 94. He could score at will under any surface or weather conditions.

Victor's first-class batting over 255 matches scored 42 centuries, 87 half-centuries and totaled 16,939 runs.

Victor Trumper was considered the greatest batsman of the Australian Golden Age and stood as the metric all batsmen were compared to until Sir Don Bradman came onto the field of play in the late 1920's.

Trumper also played rugby and was instrumental in helping to establish the first rugby league in Australia.

He died of kidney disease at the age of 37 in 1915 and 20,000 people spanned 3.5 miles behind his cortege.

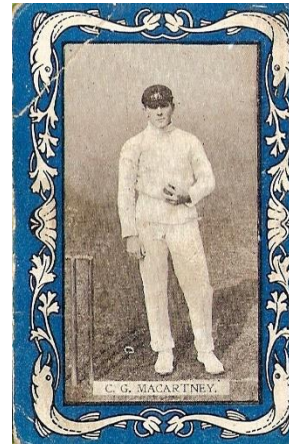
## The Audacious Attacking Batsman

C.G. McCartney was born June 27, 1886, and made his Test debut in 1907 as a bowler and mostly unimpressive batter. He befriended Victor Trumper around 1911 and began to transform himself into a focused technical batsman. In the 1921 Australia vs England 5th Test he scored 170 on the Sydney Cricket Grounds with a 12-year-old Don Bradman watching in the stands. In England during a first-class innings, he scored 345 against Nottinghamshire with the fastest triple century and highest single day score recorded by any batsman at that time.

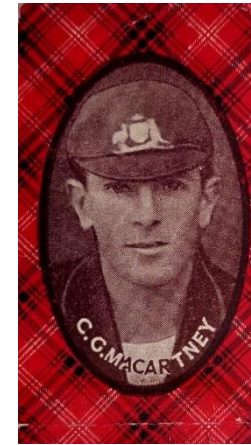
McCartney's brilliant timing and dynamic style made a grand impression on Bradman, and he later captained a New South Wales County team that included a then 18-year-old Bradman.



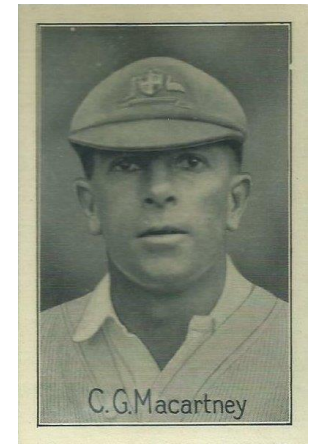

## The New Kid on the Pitch

Born on August 27, 1908, Don Bradman told his father when visiting the Sydney Cricket Grounds as a young boy that he would never be happy unless he got to play there. He did play there and went on to accomplish far more. Before his cricket career would end Bradman would establish almost every batting record, some unbelievable.

His dominating feats in his sport have led many to consider him the *greatest sportsperson in history*. His career batting average of 99.94 is akin to Babe Ruth hitting 2021 homeruns instead of 714, Tom Brady throwing 5 touchdowns or Michael Jordan scoring 49 points per game as a career average. Former Australian Team captain Bill Woodfull said Bradman was “worth three batsmen to Australia”.

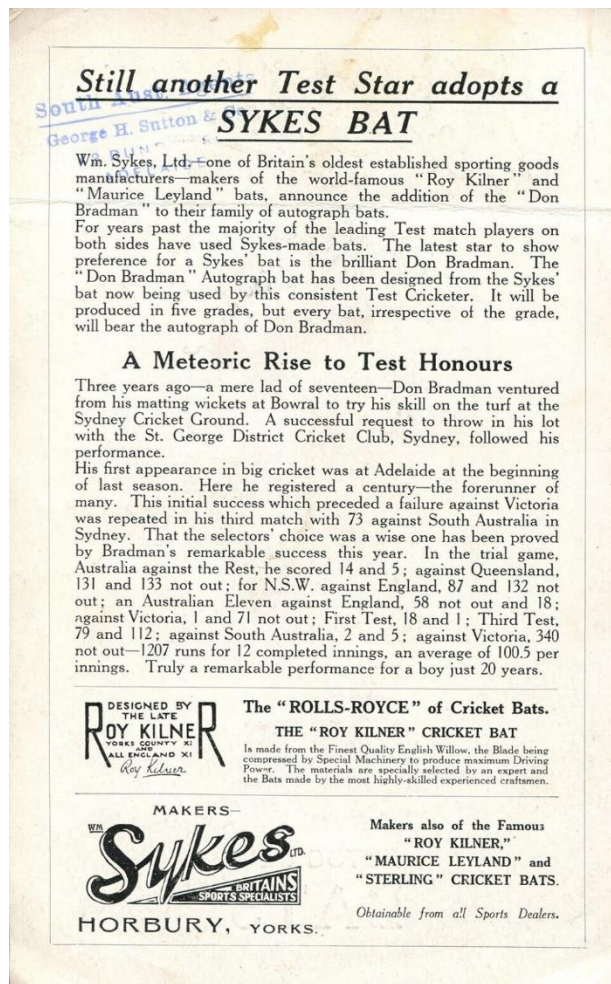

## The Sykes Bat Ad – A Triple Century & Three Days

William Sykes & Son, Ltd. was already well known as a premier cricket bat manufacturer and had several other athlete signature bats in their repertoire when they approached 20-year-old Don Bradman in January 1929.

Bradman used an unprepared Sykes bat playing for NSW, when he faced the Victoria team during a Shield game on Thursday the 24th and Friday the 25th of 1929, batting a brilliant 340 not out in just 488 minutes.

It was the first triple century of the six in his career and the highest score ever at the time and by anyone under the age of 21, a record that stood for another 45 years.

At 20 years 151 days Bradman also became the youngest batsman to score 300, with the previous record-holder being the immortal Victor Trumper at 21 years 269 days.

He never used that bat again; Sykes kept it as a souvenir on display at their factory headquarters.

The performance sealed the deal for Sykes and Bradman and during the Saturday rest day and Sunday the 27th, Sykes designed and produced the advertising card shown on the left that referenced the *Victoria, 340 not out* on the back from the previous Friday play.

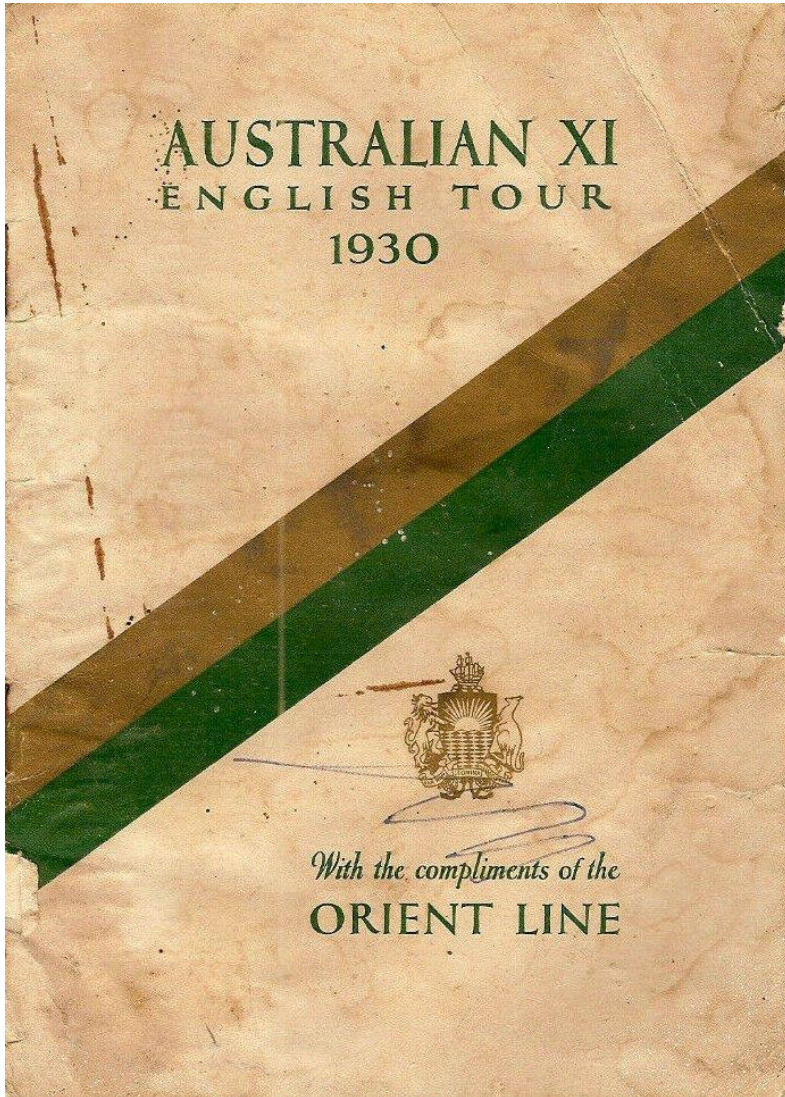
Don Bradman signed his first Sykes signature bat contract and the card shown was signed by Bradman and dated Monday 28 – 1 – 29 and was given to the contract agent company of George Sutton from Adelaide and stamped by the agency on the back.

Since none of the signature bats were in production at the time and given the autograph date, it's likely that this simple card is the very first Sykes advertising ever signed by Don Bradman and is a museum grade historical piece.

Relating directly to the Sykes signature bat process and manufactured, signed, and dated within three days at the very moment of his Sykes bat contract this is likely one of the rarest advertising objects ever from Don Bradman, the greatest cricketer in history.

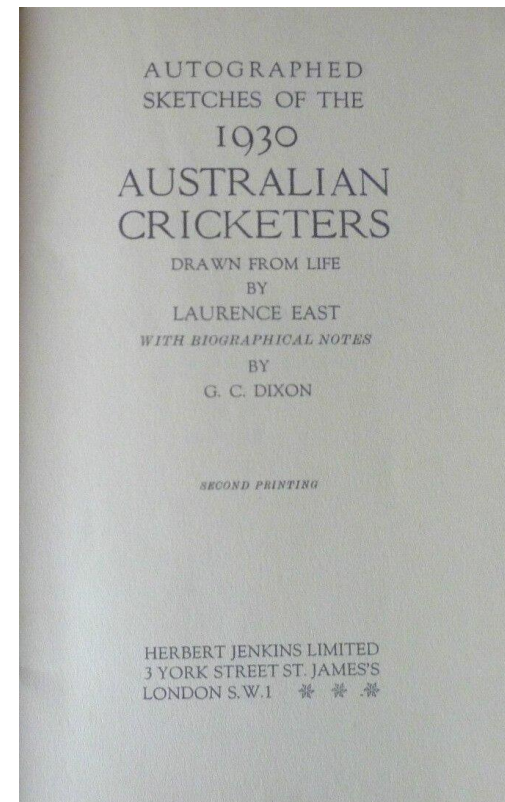

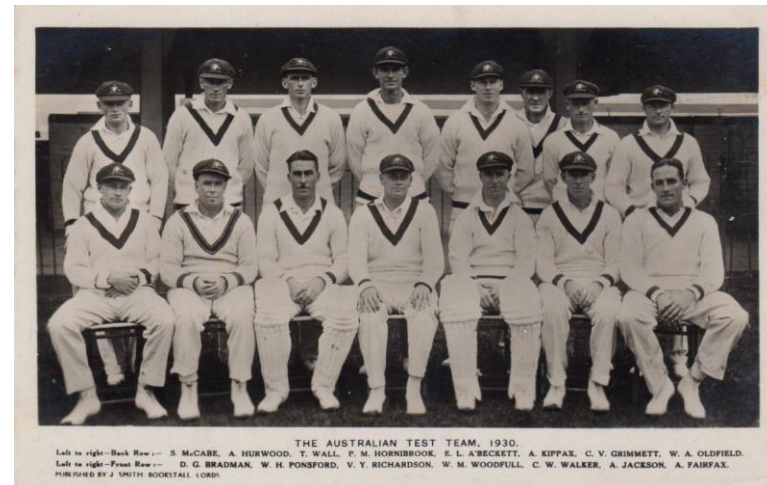

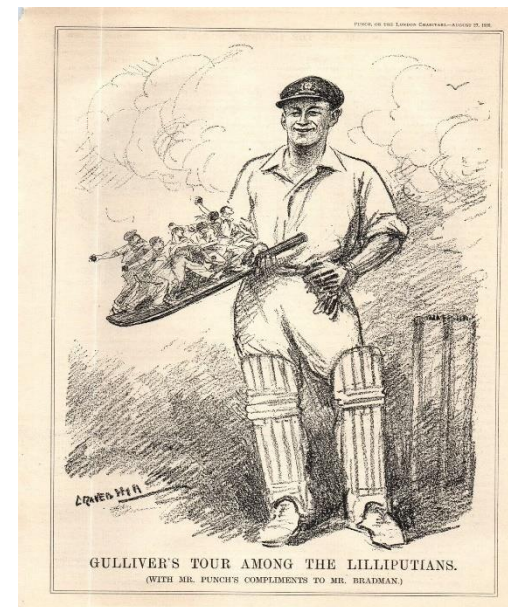

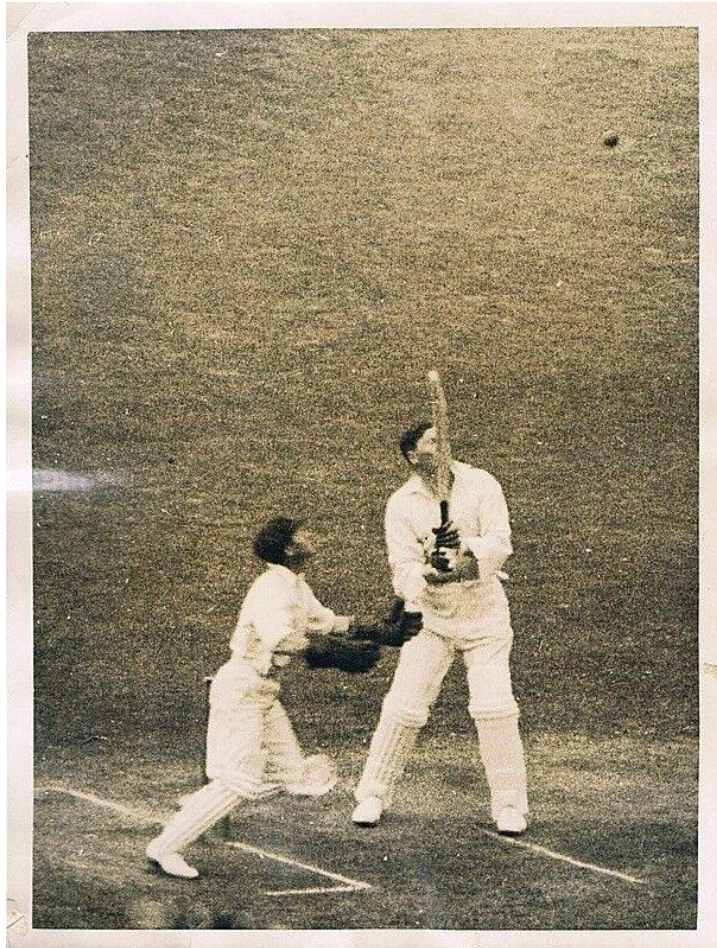

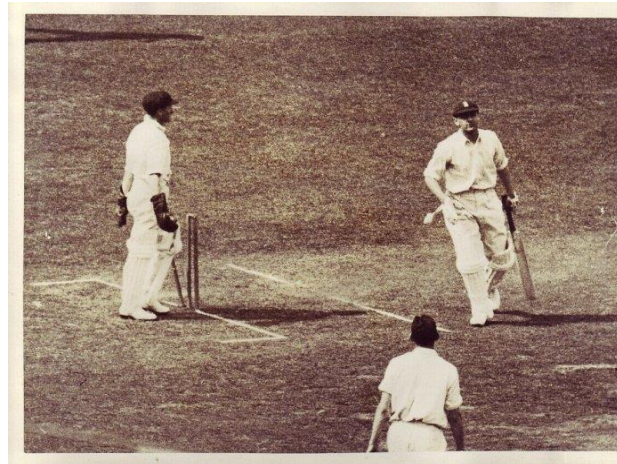

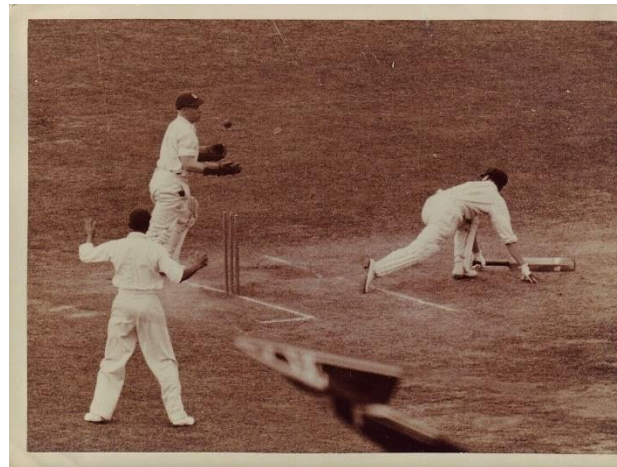

## January 6, 1930 – First-Class Innings 452

Queensland held New South Wales close on the first day. On the second day, a 21-year-old Don Bradman with bat in hand walked out onto the Sydney Cricket Ground and put forth a furious display of batting unlike anything seen before in first class cricket.

By the day's end Bradman was at 205 and the next day he unleashed a barrage once again to end the innings play carried off on the teams' shoulders with an astonishing 452 not out.

## July 11, 1930 – First-Class Test 334

That January first-class innings day set the stage for what was to occur at Headingley against England in the 3rd Test during the July 1930, Ashes contest.

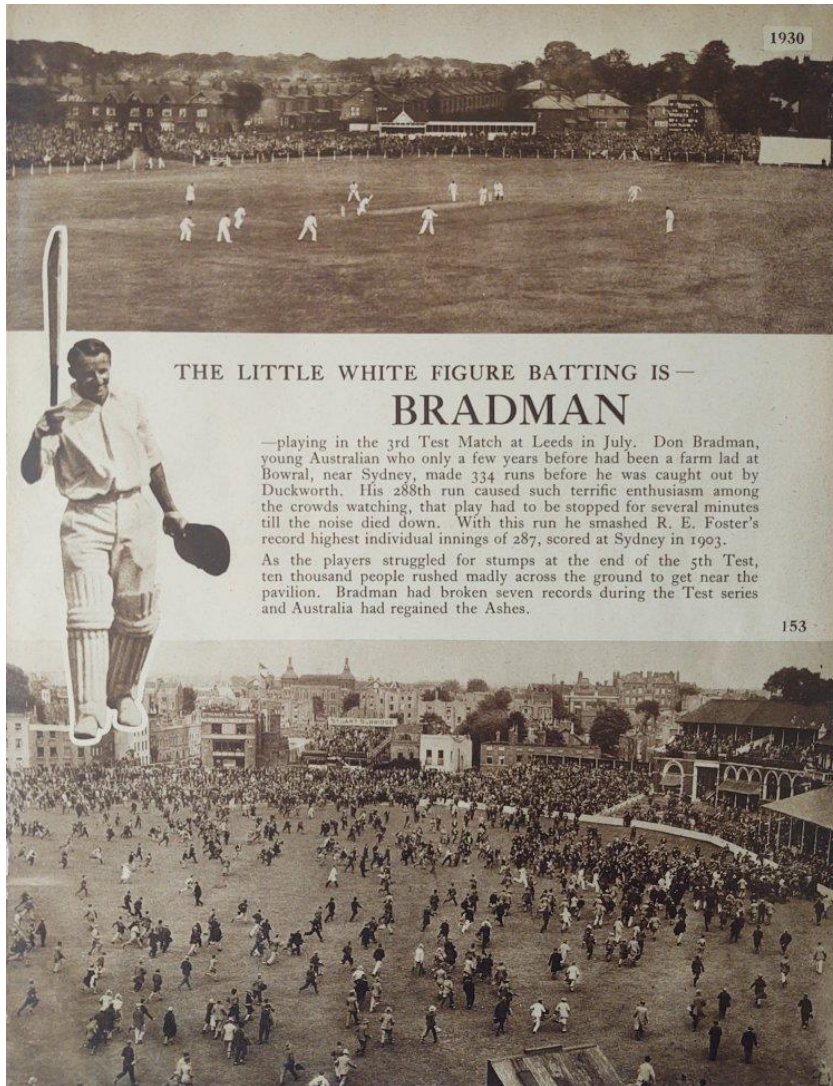
The young Bradman dominated the game that day with full confidence reaching his triple century (300 runs) in 336 minutes, the second quickest in history and became the first and only cricketer to score 300 runs in a single day ending at 309 not out. On the next morning he completed the 334 world record run of batting.

Don Bradman batting 300 in a single day still stands as one of the preeminent accomplishments in sports.

In a brief span of six months Bradman at the age of only 21 had stunned everyone by setting the world record for first-class innings which stood for 29 years and Test cricket that would stand for 73 years.

Sir Donald George Bradman was an Australian international cricketer considered to be the greatest batsman of all time. His Test batting average of 99.94 is considered perhaps the greatest achievement of any athlete in any sport in history. His average was fully 60% better than any other Test cricketer to ever play the game, as no other player has ever averaged 63.

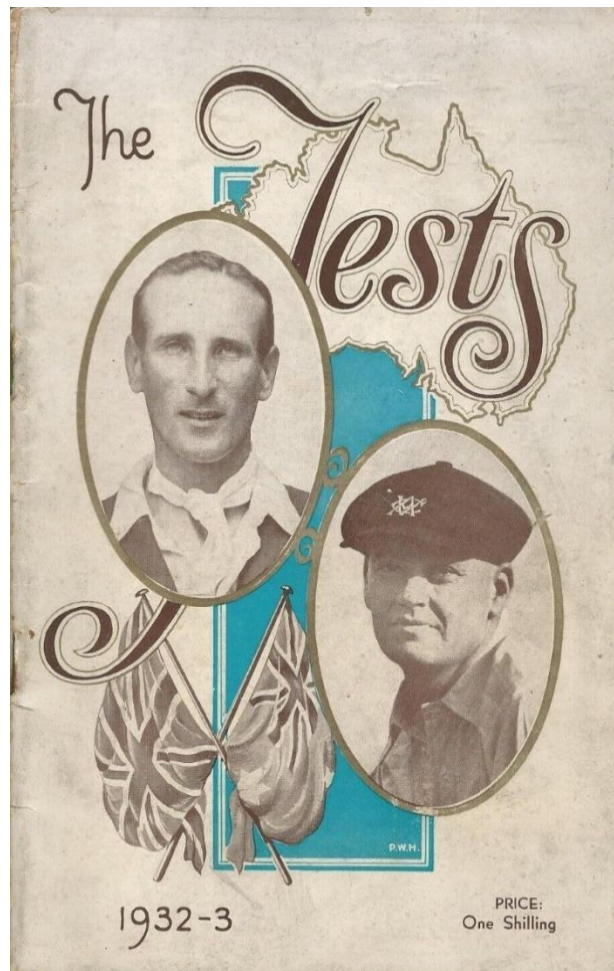

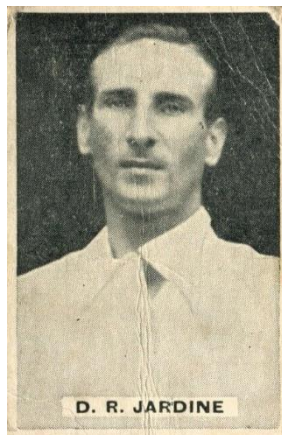
## A Dangerous Style of Play

To counter the prolific bat of Don Bradman, the English cricket team led by captain Douglas Jardine began to execute a planned style of bowling that came to be known as Bodyline. The ball was delivered online with the batters' body and would rise quickly jamming the batter's ability to cleanly hit the ball and many times just miss or physically strike the batter. With the limited safety equipment used at the time and no helmets this could be quite dangerous. This aggressive style of play was seen as unbecoming the nature of the game.

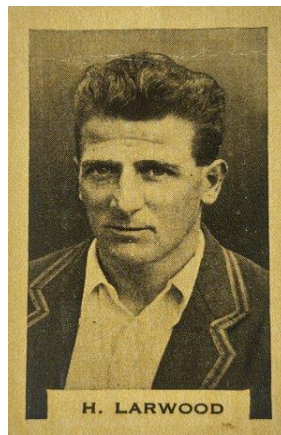
Harold Larwood and Bill Voce were very effective at delivering this form of bowling and several players namely Bill Woodfull and Bert Oldfield were severely injured after being struck.



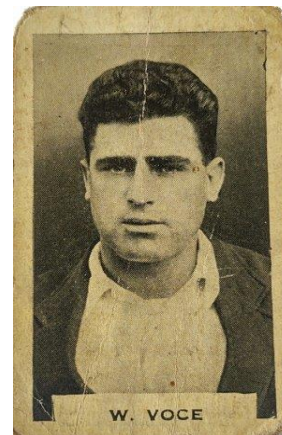

## An Unbelievable Feat, Never Done Before or Since

When Don Bradman was named as the captain of the 1936-37 Australian Team many people had their doubts and those doubts seemed fair when Bradman played badly, and the Australian team lost the first two Tests. No team had ever comeback from an 0-2 deficit in the history of cricket. However, Bradman would persevere through the loss of his newborn son, their first child and the team would rally to win the 3rd Test with a vicious attack of ground batting. Bradman and Jack Fingleton combined for 346, a world record for the 6th or in fact any wicket on Australian soil. Bradman's 270 in the 3rd Test was the finest innings by a #7 batting position and considered by Wisden *the greatest in history*.

In the 4th Test Bradman played the pitch seven hours and seventeen minutes to score 212 runs in a display of remarkable batting that turned the tide and pulled Australia even.

Australia won the coin toss for the 5th and deciding Test and batted on into the third day for a total of 604 runs. Even though he was experiencing the flu, Bradman led the three Australian players that scored centuries with 169, Jack Badcock 118, and Stan McCabe 112.

In those final three Tests of the 1936-37 Ashes, the Australian team came together to create the greatest comeback performance ever in cricket. There have been other great comebacks, but few if any have ever had so much at stake or been produced by players under such intense performance pressure, extreme emotional stress, and outright ill health.



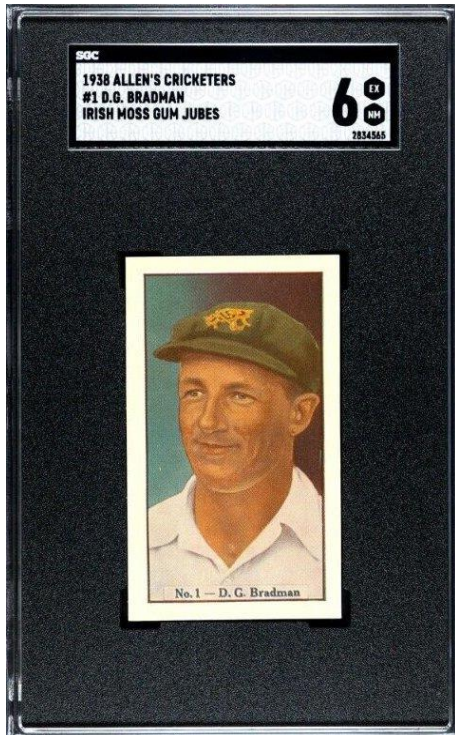

**B. A. BARNETT** (Victoria). Although he toured England in 1934 and South Africa a year later, Barnett did not play in any of the Test Matches, as Oldfield was still the world's greatest wicket-keeper. A punishing type of left-hand batsman, Barnett has been keeping wicket for Victoria since 1929. He is neat in his work behind the stumps and especially good on the leg side. On his tour of England in 1934 he played in 18 matches; his top score was 92 and his average 33.57. Before visiting England in 1938, Barnett did well in inter-State cricket. Born March 29th, 1905. (No. 17)

**D. G. BRADMAN** (New South Wales, South Australia and Australia). A right-hand batsman who has developed his skill on defensive lines, with a strong partiality for on-side strokes. He made an excellent impression on his first tour of England in 1934, getting 105 in the Lord's Test and finishing, for the first time, with a total of 1,308 runs, average 38.47. He and Fingleton made an ideal opening pair for Australia during the tour of South Africa, but, owing to an injury to his thumb, Brown did not play in all the Tests in Australia, 1936-37. He headed his University, having averaged 50, 1935, and after a year he became a regular member of the Yorkshire eleven. In 1937 his full season totalled 1,422 runs, average 33.45, and he played at Lord's before 1938. He is a very keen, dependable fielder. Yardley is a Queenslanders and returned to that State from New South Wales in 1936 to become coach for the Queensland Cricket Association. Born July 31st, 1912. (No. 39)

**C. L. BADCOCK** (South Queensland, Australia). A young batsman, his progress by his experience in the Test Matches against G. O. Allan's team in Australia, 1935-37. His best display was given in the Queensland Test at Melbourne, where he scored 118 runs. Being short, Badcock, who is a right-hand batsman, adopts an upright stance, reminiscent of the old school; he is very sound on the on-side, and his stroke play between point and mid-off is perfect. Badcock is also a brilliant outfielder. Before migrating to South Australia, he was known as the 'Tennant's' batsman and in 1934-35, with an average of 124.30, he had the distinction of heading the South Australian averages. (1-24) before then. (No. 11)

**S. BARNES** (New South Wales). Before he was chosen to represent Australia in England this year, Sidney Barnes had a remarkably successful season in inter-State matches. He made 773 runs for his State, average 76.27, and by scoring 110 against Victoria he greatly assisted New South Wales to win the Sheffield Shield. A confident batsman with a variety of strokes, he drives brilliantly, while as a defensive player he can be a thorn in the side of any batsman. Barnes is also a useful slow bowler and a reliable open fieldman. He made a wonderful catch on the leg boundary when a batsman against M.C.C. in 1937. He is the youngest member of the 1938 Australian touring team. Born June 5th, 1917. (No. 30)

## The Invincibles

In 1948 the Australian Cricket Team travelled to England and became the only Test match side to play an entire tour of England without losing a single match. This amazing achievement ultimately earned them the nickname "The Invincibles" and they are regarded even today as perhaps the greatest assembled cricket team of all time.

The team Captain was Sir Don Bradman in his fourth and final tour of England. He had announced that this would be his final international tour and huge crowds came out to the arena for a chance to see the great Bradman play one more time. The attendance record for a Test match was broken three times during this tour, 158,000 at Headingley is a record today.

On May 15, 1948, the Australian team scored a world record 721 points in a single six-hour period against Essex.

The June 24-29 2nd Test was considered by most Australian players to be a regal event. Ian Johnson got off the bus to walk through the hallowed gates of Lords. This extremely rare 2nd Test full scorecard from the 1948 England tour shows Australia winning the match by 409 runs.

Three players on the 1948 team were inaugural inductees into the Australian Cricket Hall of Fame and five from this team were named to Australia's Team of the Century.

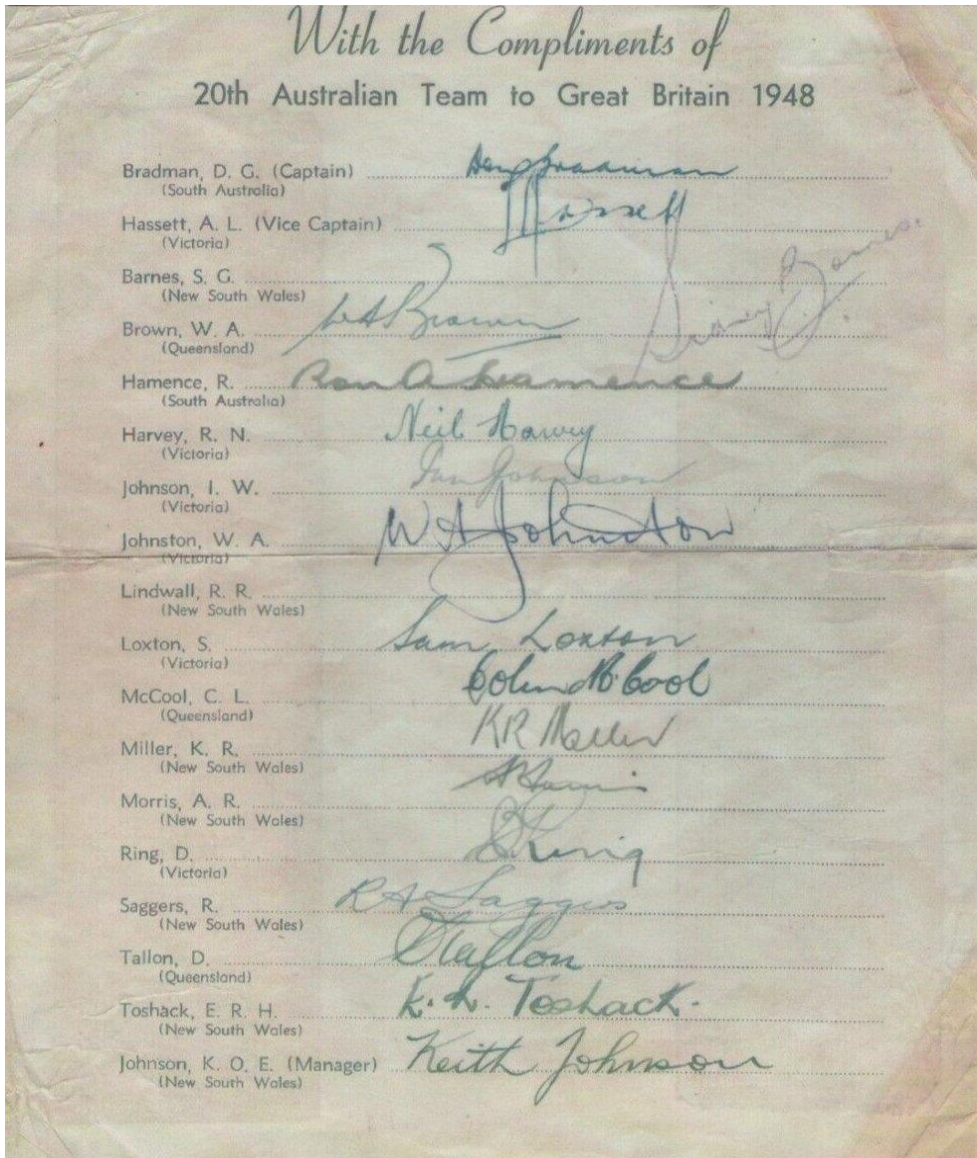

## Don Bradman's Unexpected Duck

The 5th Test between England and Australia at the Oval was already a highly anticipated event made even more so because Don Bradman had announced it was his last.

When Don Bradman walked out of the stands for his last Test on August 14, 1948, he needed 4 runs to average 100 and everyone in attendance had high expectations.

Instead, Bradman did the unexpected, a two ball Duck. He scored *no runs*, almost unheard of during his career.

By failing to score any runs he became the greatest batter in Cricket history with a career run average of 99.94 and the 5th Test of England versus Australia became a classic.

## One of the Rarest Scorecards – Lost for 54 Years

One of the two 5th Test umpires was Herbert Baldwin who had once played for Surrey and umpired first-class Cricket including nine Tests over almost three decades.

There were two full and numerous truncated scorecards for the event. Bradman signed several and Herbert Baldwin had one kept until 21 years later in 1969 when he passed.

The Baldwin scorecard disappeared into estate obscurity for more than 50 years until a young woman purchased a box of old documents and papers in Aylsham, Norfolk just 180 miles northeast of Hartley Wintney, the village where Herbert Baldwin was born and died.

Inside she found the rare 1948 5th Test full filled scorecard complete with the 10th wicket neatly folded and preserved.

The Baldwin and Don Bradman signed full scorecards are shown on the left testament to one of the greatest events and athletic careers in all of sports history.

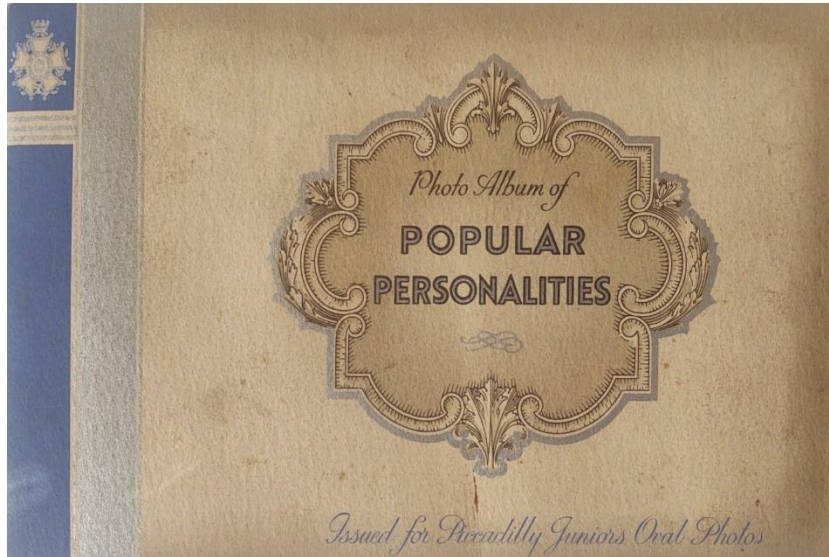

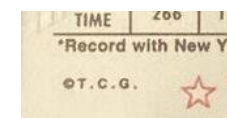
## Authentic or Counterfeit?

Although retouched and/or trimmed originals and counterfeit cards show up in the sports card world the 1983 Topps '52 Mantle reprint was unique as Professional Sports Authenticator (PSA) graded a series of counterfeits that still circulate today.

These counterfeits, some of which had 180 degree reversed backs, are easily identified due to the small font size of the Topps Chewing Gum (T.C.G.) logo on the reverse side.

PSA has since deactivated the certification of both PSA 10 and many PSA 9 grade 1983 Mantle cards.

The first printings of these pre-Tiffany blue boxed sets were notorious for off-centering and edge cut fraying and good examples graded NM-MT PSA 8 or above are very difficult to find and expensive.

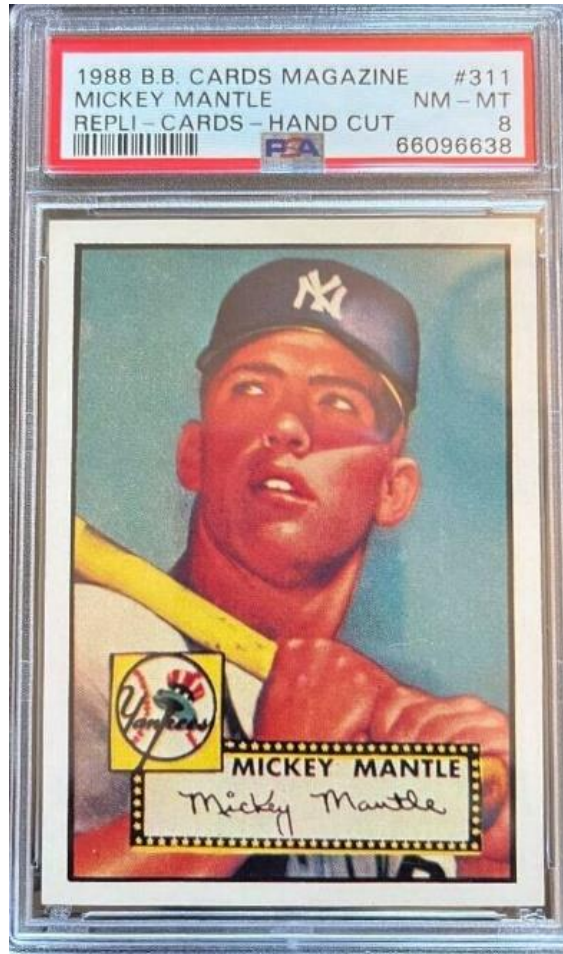
Being the first reprint of the famous 1952 Mantle and with all the print and counterfeit issues this is one of the most unique and interesting reprint cards Topps has ever released.

In 1983, Topps introduced the Topps 1952 Reprint Series. It was available to hobby dealers in cases of 24 sets or directly to collectors through mail order. The set box design launched the Topps Tiffany franchise. The reprint cards differentiated from the original by being printed on white card stock with a high-gloss coating, smaller 2 1/2" X 3 1/2" standard-size and each card is marked "TOPPS 1952 REPRINT SERIES" on the back. It is believed that only 10,000 sets were printed. The set contained 402 of the original 407 cards as Topps was unable to obtain permission from 5 players or their families to print their cards.

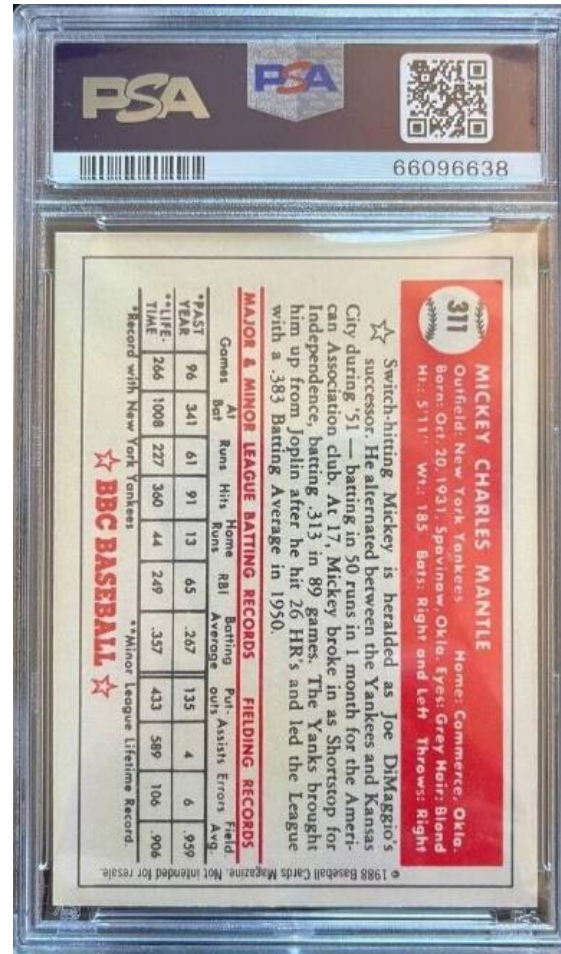

## Honus Wagner "The Flying Dutchman"

The greatest shortstop ever to play the game of baseball.  
3,420 hits, winning eight batting titles during a .328/.391/.467 over his 21-year career.

Hitting just 101 career home runs, he drove in 1,733 runs and topped the 100-RBI mark nine times, leading the league category on five separate occasions. He was part of the inaugural Hall of Fame class in 1936, tying Babe Ruth for the second-highest vote total.

## 1903 E107 Breisch-Williams Honus Wagner Rookie Card

*This is known to be the earliest card of this player.*

It came inside the first large set of the 20th century, 159 cards produced by Breisch-Williams, a confectionery company that began adding cards to its caramel candy products. They were one of the very first manufacturing companies that started the innovation of advertising their products by adding baseball cards to the packaging.

And the concept caught on quickly, as many other companies started including this business model – including the American Tobacco Company. But this 1903 card set established the tone for the rest of the decade and how companies utilized and created value in packaging.

The 1903 set contained most of the league's best players back then. It also included many well-known baseball cards, including Cy Young, Eddie Plank, and of course, Honus Wagner.

One surprising thing about this card is the image, it shows Wagner dressed in a suit and tie. The example shown was found in estate antiques with several premium 1951 hockey cards and an EX/MT 1955 Bowman Hank Aaron #179. But you won't find this card in Mint condition – most are in poor condition, but the value is still very high.

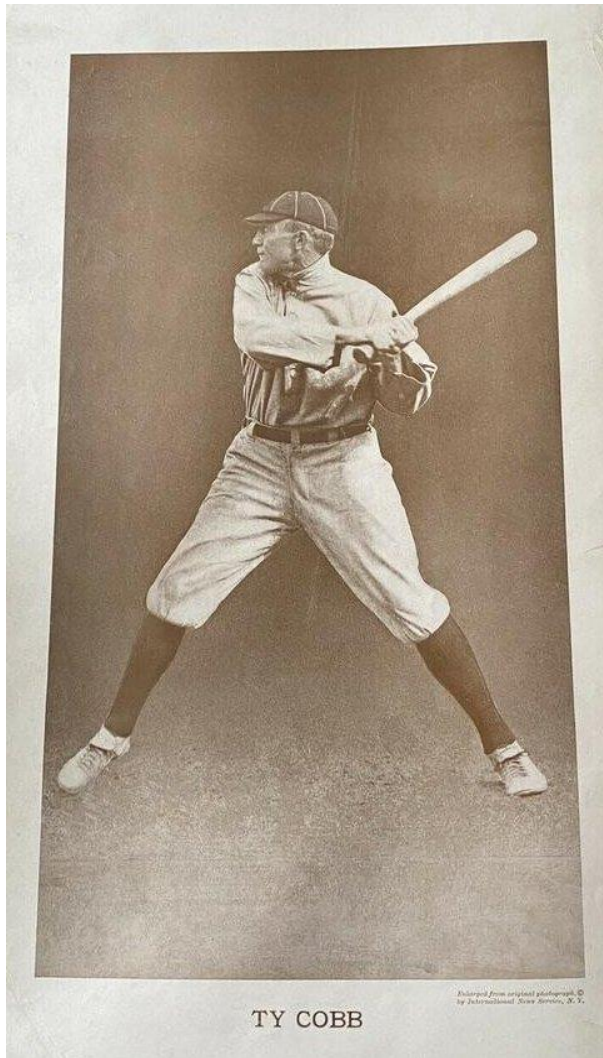
The 1903 E107 Wagner is considered a "Holy Grail" baseball card preceding by six years the multimillion-dollar 1909 T206 Honus Wagner cards. T206 card production was halted at about sixty cards. Only six graded E107 Breisch-Williams Wagner cards have ever surfaced.

In very poor condition the E107 Wagner card is worth \$100,000. But that's at the bottom of rarity pricing for this card, while cleaner cards might be worth mid-six or even seven figures.

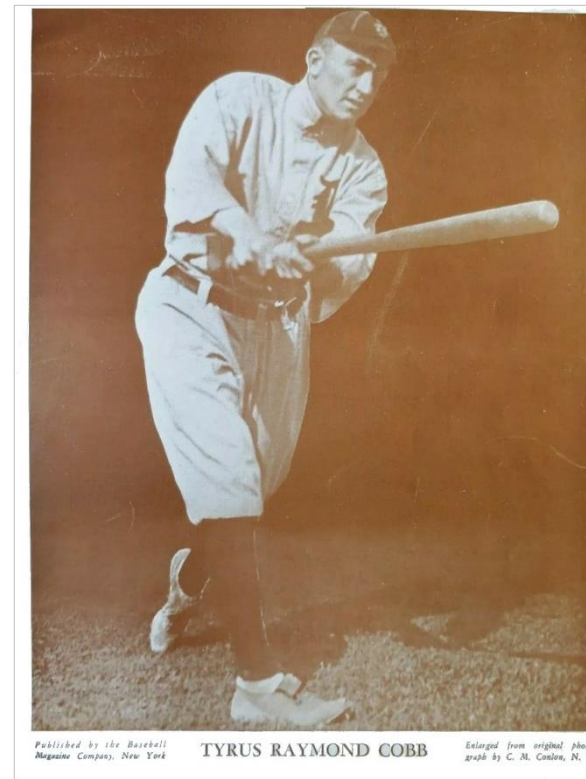
The rarity of the E107 cannot be overstated! It is approximately ten times rarer than the famous T206 Wagner card, and many collectors could not even tell you what it looks like!

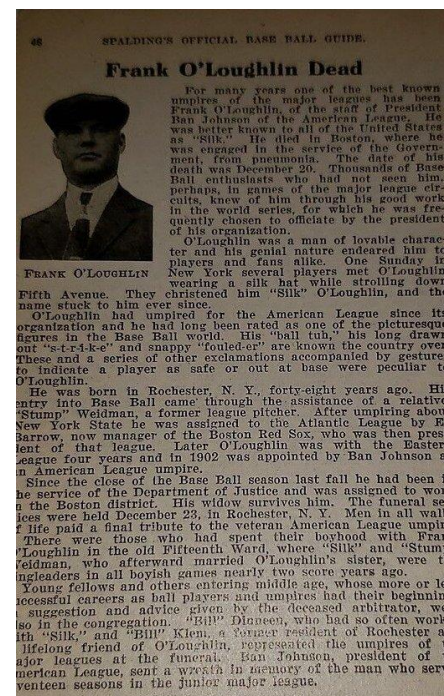

Born in 1872 in Rochester, New York, Francis (Frank) H. O’Loughlin was nicknamed “Silk” at a young age due his silky hair. He umpired semi-pro baseball games in 1895 and moved to professional Atlantic League baseball in 1897, Eastern League from 1898 until 1901 and the MLB American League for 17 seasons from 1902 until 1918. He umpired a record 6 no-hitters and 31 games in five World Series (1906, 1909, 1912, 1915, 1917). On May 1, 1908, O’Loughlin became the **first umpire to eject Ty Cobb** from a baseball game.

He is credited with many of the umpire patterns still in use today including loud verbal calls, hand signals for strikes and balls and well-defined uniforms with creased pants.

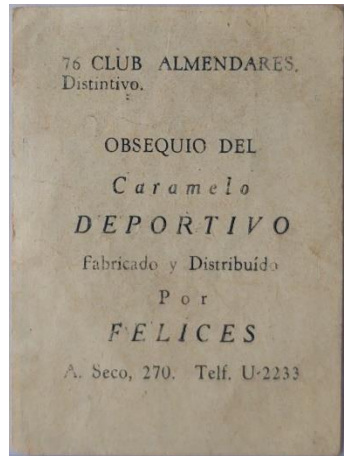
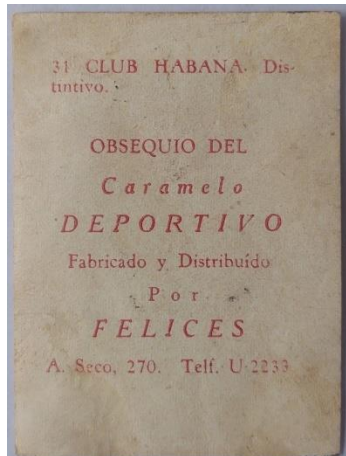
After the 1909 World Series that pitted Ty Cobb against Honus Wagner the Detroit team travelled to Cuba from 10/3 – 12/19 to play twelve games against two Cuban teams without Ty Cobb or Sam Crawford. Harris Bros. Co. of Havana produced a 35-card set in red (Habana), blue (Almendares), and black (Detroit) to promote the teams and Frank O’Loughlin (mis-spelled in error as O’Laughlin) would be immortalized as the only **non-player** on a Cuban 1909 Cabanas Detroit “D” black background baseball card.

He failed in a run for New York State Assembly in 1904 and would contract and die of influenza in 1918 at the age of 46.

Only seven O’Laughlin cards have been graded between SGC, PSA and BGS. The incredibly rare 1909 Cabanas set is considered by many as the Holy Grail of Cuban baseball cards.

## 1909 – Detroit Tigers Faced a Long Time Rivalry

When the Detroit Tigers travelled to Cuba in October 1909 they faced two of the most established Cuban league teams and stepped into the middle of a long time baseball rivalry between the Habana and Almendares teams.

Habana won 30 Cuban League championships (more than any other club).  
Almendares won 24 Cuban League championships.

Detroit without Ty Cobb or Sam Crawford faced two formidable opponents and lost the series 4-8.

The team flag cards shown are part of the 1945-46 Caramelo Deportivo set issued in Cuba. These cards, as well as most Cuban card issues are extremely thin and delicate and difficult to find in good condition.

The Baseball Register or “The Official Baseball Register” was an annual publication by The Sporting News from 1940 until 2007 and contained detailed information and statistics on major league baseball players, managers, coaches, and teams. This first edition was published in 1940 and the front cover featured the famous Charles Conlon photograph of Ty Cobb stealing third base against Jimmy Austin of the New York Highlanders (Yankees). From 1940 until 1965 it was presented with the title “The Game’s 400”.

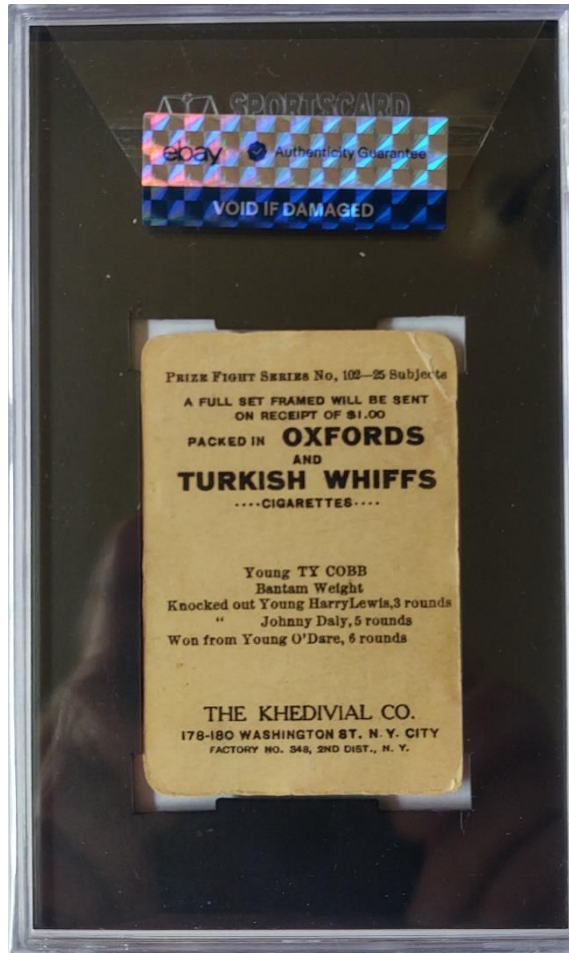
After he retired in 1928, Ty Cobb was voted into the first Baseball Hall of Fame induction class with 222 out of 226 votes beating out Babe Ruth, Honus Wagner, Christy Mathewson, and Walter Johnson in 1936. He was reported to have held over 90 major league baseball records some of which are considered unbreakable even by the playing standards today. The 1938 Sporting News Record Holders Panel above (right) depicts some of the Cobb records and the panel itself from that 1938 publication could be considered somewhat rare.

## Ty Cobb the Boxer?

It was not uncommon for people to use the name of more well-known or famous athletes and entertainers to draw some attention to themselves during the early 20th century.

A boxer named Sammy Kolb began to use the name Ty Cobb, capitalizing on the popularity of the professional baseball player Ty Cobb.

Kolb had a career from 1909 until 1922 and in his final year of boxing he would fight a boxer billed as Babe Ruth on a cold winter night in Philadelphia. Kolb/Cobb would win the fight in a six-round decision.

When the Khedivial/Surbrug Series 102 cards were produced Kolb's real name was not used and instead Ty Cobb was printed on his card.

This changed what would have been a basic vintage boxing tobacco card from the set into a highly unique and desirable collectible piece of rare Ephemera.

After more than 100 years this simple piece of ink printed cardboard is a true work of art and a copy resides in the Ephemera collection of the Metropolitan Museum of Art as a part of The Jefferson R. Burdick Collection.

SGC Authentic Grade / PSA Authenticated

In 1898, the Surbrug Tobacco Company with John W. Surbrug as its President went into the cigarette business featuring Milo, a Turkish brand. Surbrug purchased the Khedivial Company and began to place T225 cards inside their tobacco cigarette packs. The complete Khedivial/Surbrug set consisted of 50 cards released in two series. Series 101 had 25 cards with a dull gray border and Series 102 had another 25 with an off-white border. Series 102 is considered rare compared to the Series 101 cards and is found at a 1:4 ratio.

Instead of popular baseball players like the 1909-11 T206 tobacco cards, Khedivial/Surbrug placed pictures of boxers on theirs including some of the periods more successful athletes. This Ty Cobb card is considered one of the most desirable cards of the scarce 102 series by both boxing and baseball enthusiasts and this card is quite rare and highly sought. The Khedivial/ Surbrug Company was sold to the Tobacco Products Company in 1912 making these 100+ year old cards become even more limited in numbers.

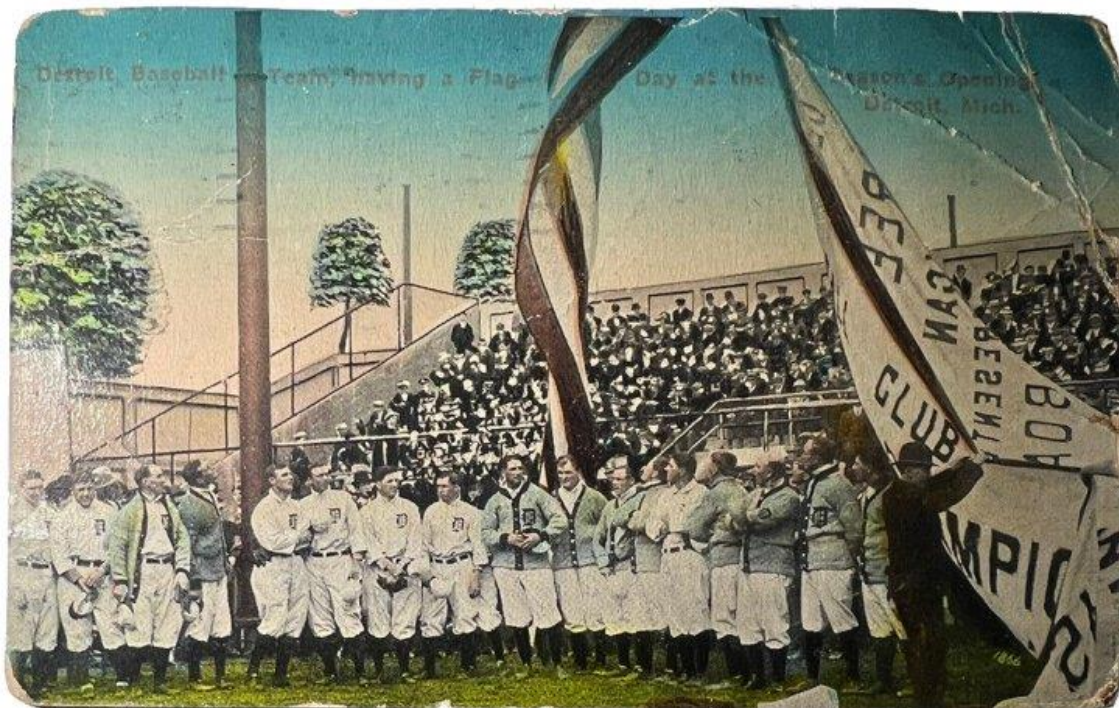
The dedication and opening of Frank Navin's new ballpark were originally scheduled for Thursday April 18, 1912, but as fate would have it rain washed out any festivities for that day and the decision was to move the opening day to Saturday April 20, 1912, due to Navin feeling that Friday was a bad luck day.

The picture on the right depicts the day. The postcard below is particularly famous for capturing the Navin Field opening with Ty Cobb in attendance. Notice how the stands have been filled with people and leaves are added to the trees.

Cobb stands on the far right in a Detroit "D" sweater looking up at the American flag.

Officially 24,382 people entered the new park, but estimates were as high as 26,000. Detroit would win the exciting game 6-5 over Cleveland in 11 innings, but the media news was mostly focused on the sinking of the RMS Titanic just five days previous.

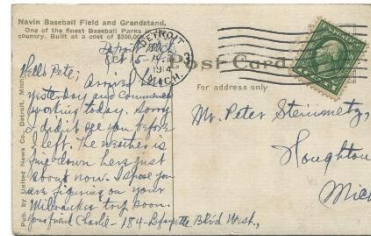
This 100-plus-year-old postcard of baseball history is somewhat difficult to find today, and examples in fair to good condition often are priced between \$500 to \$1000.



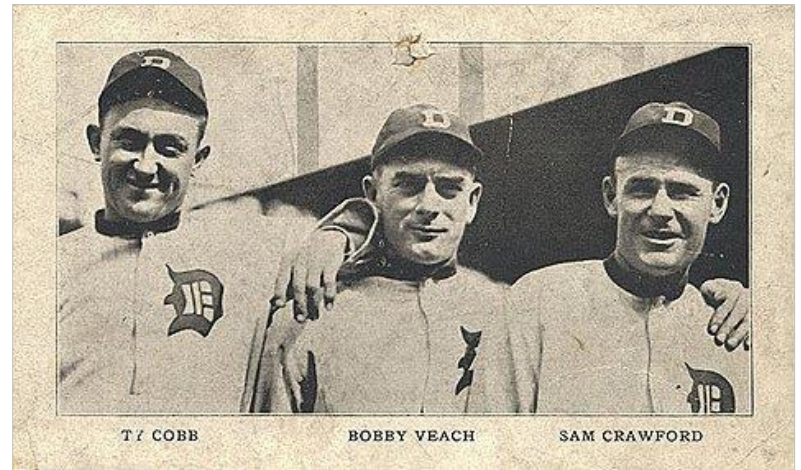

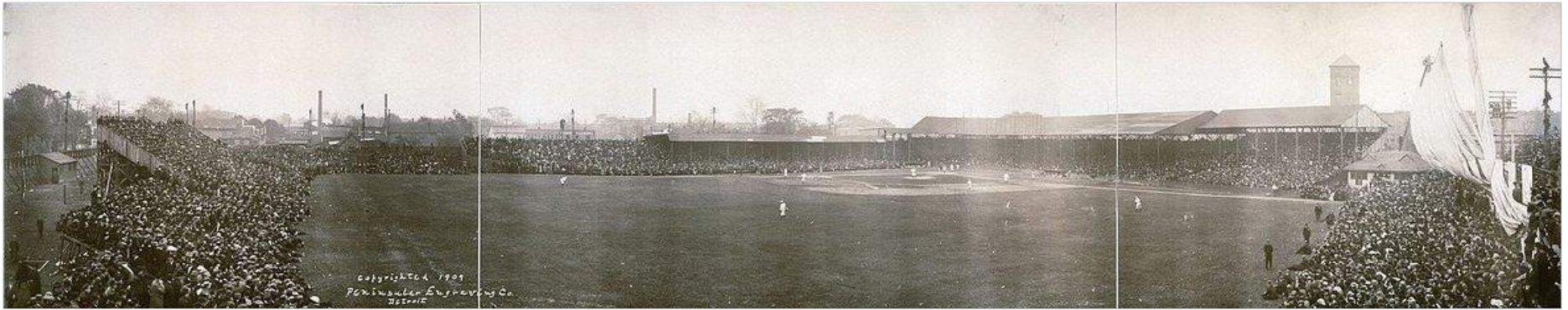

This circa 1923/24 Navin Stadium postcard above shows Ty Cobb in center field while Harry Heilmann stands with hands on hips in right field. Heilmann replaced Sam Crawford in that position by 1917 and the stadium is post 1923 redesign. By the 1927 postmark Cobb had signed with the Philadelphia Athletics.

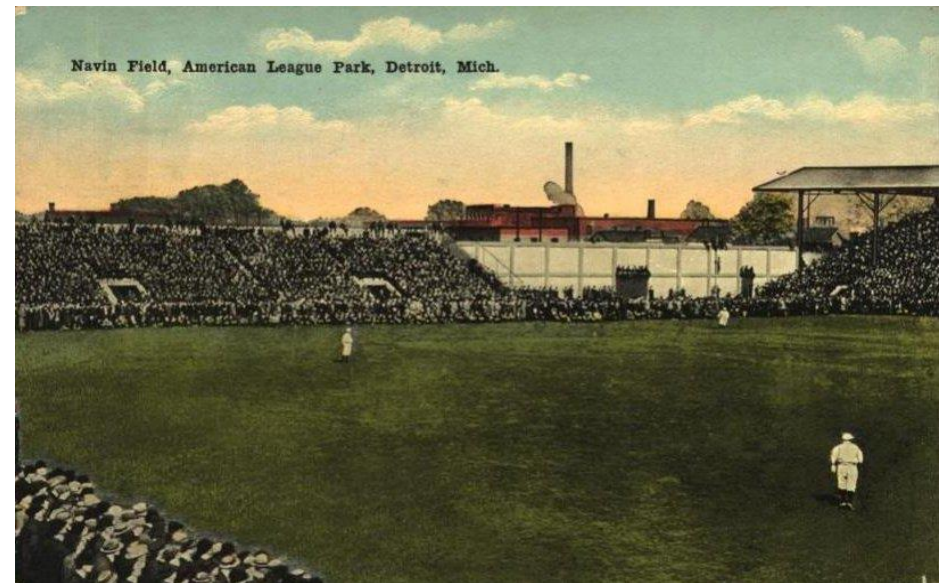

This original 1913/14 postcard dated October 5 and postmarked 1914 shows the left to right field angle of then Navin Field. Note the building smokestacks and telephone/power poles and the fine details of the foreground spectators relative to the 1909 image left side panel.

The colors, lighting and shadows along with building and grandstand features match period photographs. This is considered to be one of the best original Ty Cobb postcard photographs of the early period.

It was common practice to hand alter photographs and in this 1920 postmarked copy of the 1914 postcard alterations are very noticeable. Smokestacks and poles have been removed, building features, trees and clouds have been inked in or deeply colored and most notable is Bobby Veach in the LF foreground.

Sky was added, the field darkened and cropped. Veach was likely added since his shadow is at a different angle than those of Cobb and Crawford. The original 1914 image does not show pixilation in that area. Foreground spectators have shifted and lost photographic detail and grey hazing can be seen in front.

There are numerous versions of this cropped and altered photograph with different details and clouds.

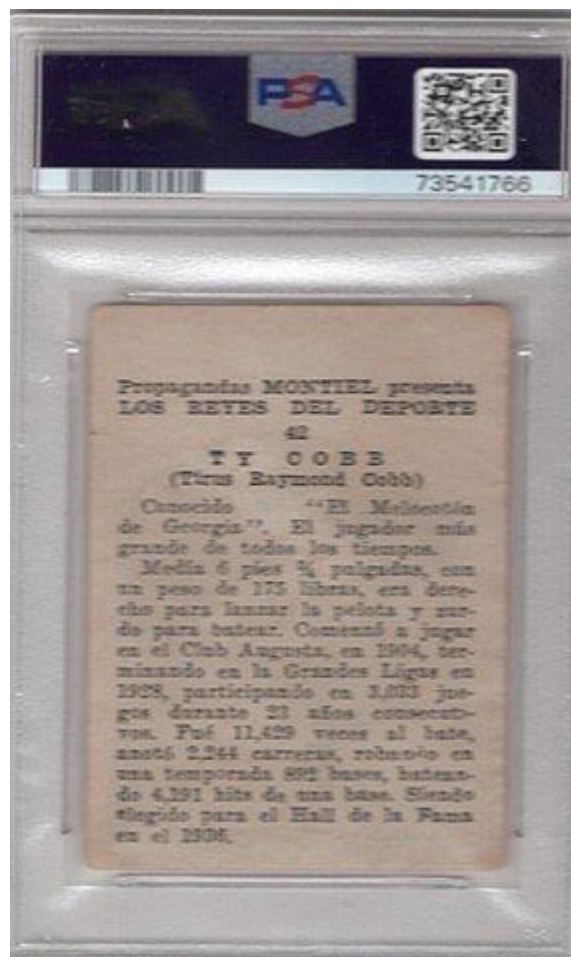

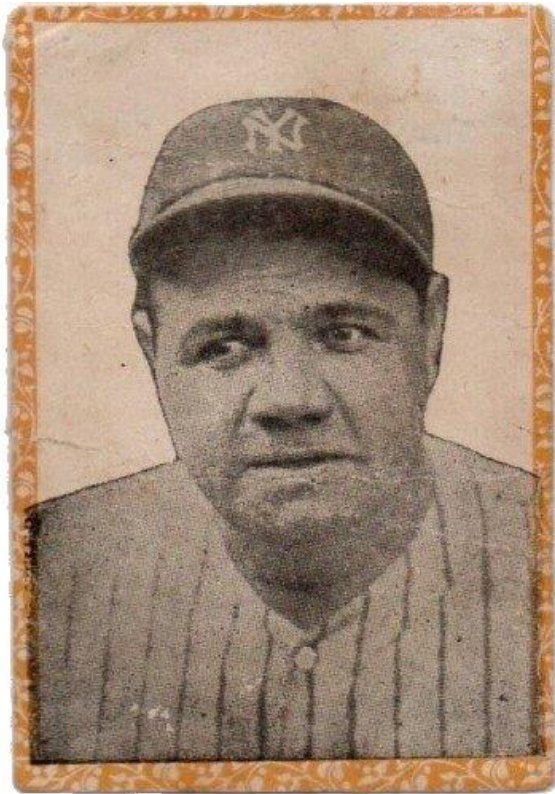
This series of caramel candy cards from Montiel were one of the first major sports-card sets issued after World War II. The Los Reyes del Deporte name can be roughly translated to Sporting Kings or Kings of Sports. The set is sometimes classified as a 1946 issue and as a 1946-47 set. The cards were primarily baseball players, but also included boxers, wrestlers and one tennis player, Helen Wills Moody.

Cards numbered from 1-100 had a yellow or somewhat more difficult to find orange border around a stark black and white photo with no name or information on the front side. The cards from 101-180 retained the border but centered the picture within a semi-circle plaque style yellow background and included the name and position of the athlete on the front. All the cards had the name and athlete information on the back. Super condition sensitive being printed on very thin paper stock and released in Cuba during the mid-1940's makes the prospect of finding a high grade almost impossible. The PSA 2 above is the highest graded PSA non-qualifier in existence and these elusive cards demand very high prices.

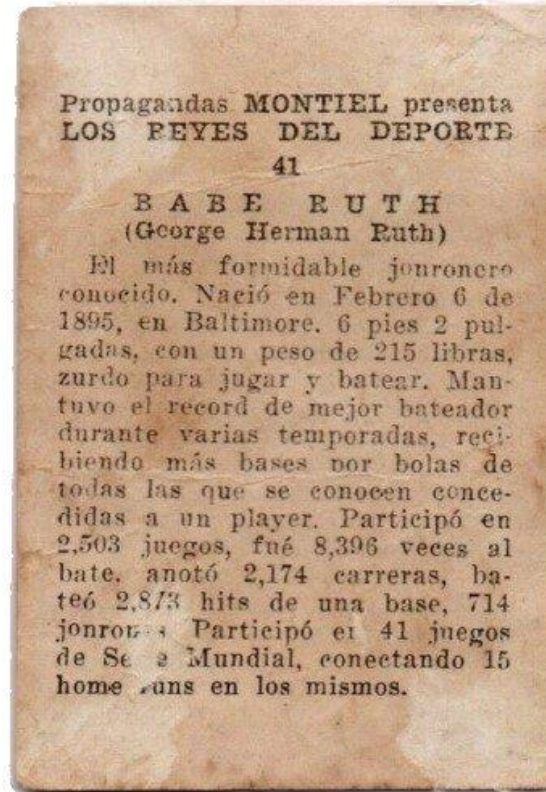

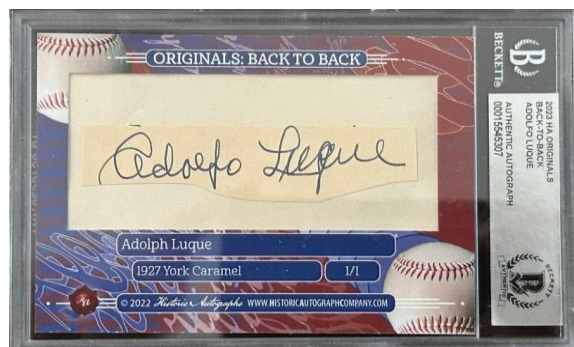
## 1946 Propagandas Montiel Los Reyes del Deporte #14 – James J Braddock (The Cinderella Man)

James Walter Braddock was an American boxer nicknamed The Cinderella Man who was the world heavyweight champion from 1935 to 1937. Braddock would become one of the most unlikely sports legends in the history of boxing. During the early 1930's of the Great Depression, Braddock had become a broken down and out of luck athlete that seemed to mirror the everyday man and woman suffering to exist on the streets during the Depression.

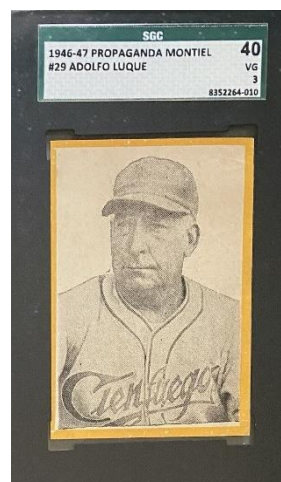
He would return to the ring in one last gasp attempt to define himself as a boxer and to provide for his family. Against all odds, Braddock would win over and over moving up through the ranks to finally challenge as a 10-1 underdog and defeat the feared Heavyweight Champion of the World, Max Baer for the coveted title. He became the subject of the biographical movie Cinderella Man by Ron Howard and was portrayed by Russell Crowe.

Adolfo Domingo De Guzmán "Dolf" Luque was the first Latino pitcher in Major League Baseball, the first to win a World Series victory, and the first to lead the Leagues in wins and shutouts. A native of Havana, Cuba, Luque debuted in 1911, played the Cuban League from 1912-1945 and played Major League Baseball on four teams in the U.S. from 1914-1935. He coached in Major League Baseball from 1936-1937 and 1941-1945 with the New York Giants and was a team manager with six teams in Mexico from 1946-1956.

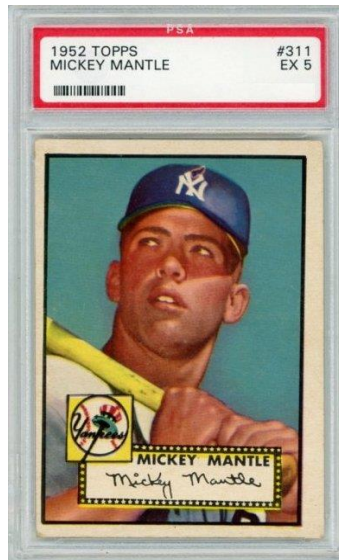
He is the all-time Cuban League leader with 22 years pitching, won two MLB World Series (1919, 1933) was the MLB wins leader (1923) and MLB ERA leader (1923, 1925). Luque was enshrined in the Cuban Baseball Hall of Fame in 1957, the Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame in 1967 and the Mexican Baseball Hall of Fame in 1985.

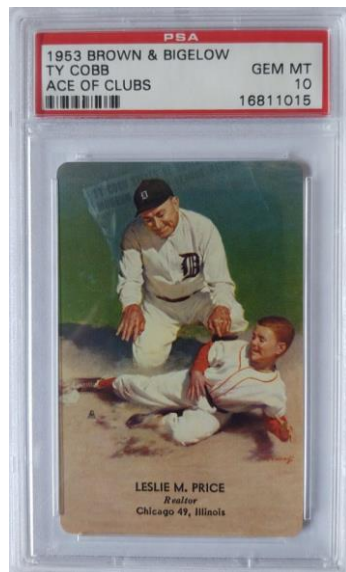

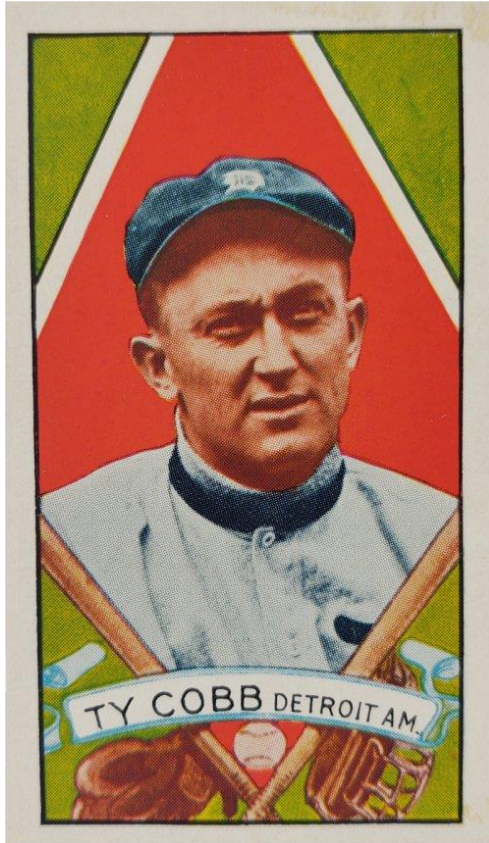

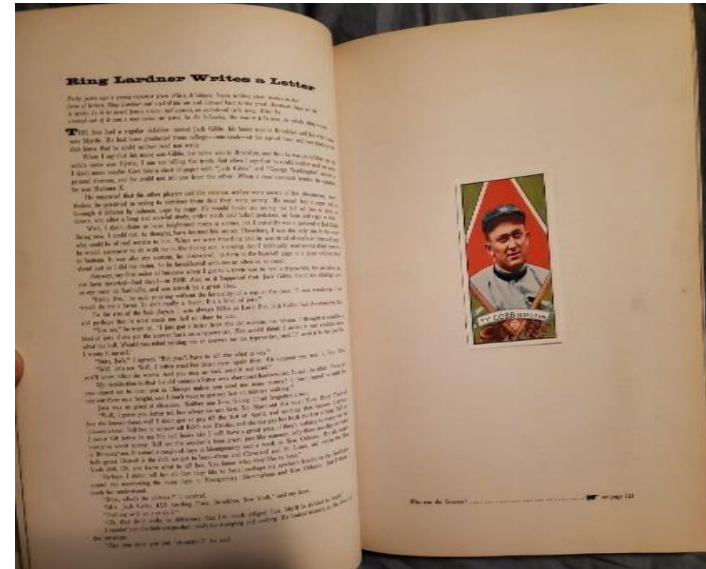

The Fall 1956 issue of the quarterly men's lifestyle publication, Gentry (1951-57) offered a rather unique card among an assortment of other sections including fashion, photography and literature. To non-collectors, nothing about the card would have been familiar except the name of the subject, Ty Cobb. But for any of the publication's readers that collected early baseball cards, the style would have been overwhelmingly familiar. It was essentially a remake of Cobb's T202 and T205 baseball cards using a different Cobb image.

In 1911, the American Tobacco Company issued the T205 gold border set. Today, it remains one of the most popular baseball card sets across all eras that was ever produced.

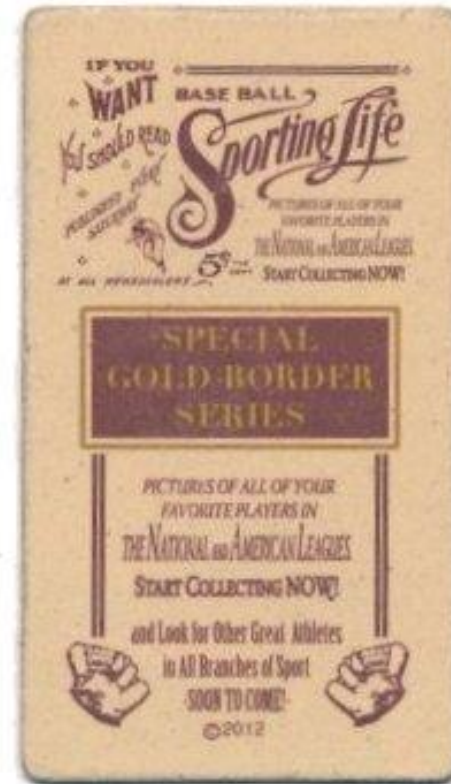
In 1912, the T202 Hassan Triple Folder cards were issued and the Gentry Magazine card was clearly styled after the T202 insert. Of course, that means it followed the 1911 T205 style. Using a colorized photograph of Cobb instead of lithography and measuring a larger 2 1/4" x 4", it is not a duplicate of the original T202 printing, but the design with the baseball diamond and equipment/banner at the bottom is practically identical. The 1956 Gentry magazine Ty Cobb card is considered rather rare and sought after by vintage card collectors.

**GEORGE HERMAN (BABE) RUTH**  
GREATEST PLAYER EVER



Baseball's all-time home-run slugger, one of the top six in batting average, an exceptional fielder and base runner, a remarkable pitcher, great drawing card and a man who always made ball clubs winners. It was little wonder that the Sultan of Swat was voted the greatest player in the history of the sport. The Babe threw and batted left-handed. He was born in Baltimore Feb. 6, 1895 and died Aug. 16, 1948.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS**


The Babe could do everything on the baseball field. There was no batting wheel records he might have set had he been a pitcher throughout his career. Brought up from the minors at 19, he won 39 games in a little more than four years for the Boston Red Sox. In 1916, he won 23 games with a 1.75 earned run average. He won 24 the following year and in 1918 and 1919, he pitched a record 29½ successive innings on World Series play. Boston soon recognized his powerful bat and sent him in the outfield on his non-pitching days. He hit 73 homers in 1919, the most anyone had ever hit in a season. Records of baseball collections, Boston sent the Babe to the Yankees. In 1920, his 54th year as a Yankee, he hit an unbelievable 54 homers, hit 39 and 35 the next two. (Some statistics seem to use the Babe's mighty bat without going and baseball progressed such as it never had. In 1923, the Yanks built Yankee Stadium—the house that Babe Ruth built. The Babe went on to lead 174 lifetime homers, the greatest hit output ever. The Babe's booming 42-ounce bat went on to produce numerous records, the most notable being the 60 home runs he hit in the 1927 154 game season. His lifetime 342 homers is among the top legends. In 1933, he hit 30 in 32 games. His final season, he played for the Boston Braves, and typically, the Babe hit three home runs in the last game he played; he was voted into the Hall of Fame in 1937.

**TRISTRAM E. SPEAKER**  
CENTER FIELDER



The Grey Eagle set the standard for center fielders. He was the same type player as Ty Cobb, and was close to him in all-around excellence. This came to the majors to stay in 1908 with the Boston Red Sox. He went to Cleveland in 1916 and later played with Washington and the Philadelphia A's, his final year being 1928. Tris threw and batted left-handed, and was born April 4, 1888 in Hubbard City, Tex., and died Dec. 8, 1958.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS**


Tris, a one-time Texas cowhand, had one liability when he was playing. He came along the same time as Cobb, and was thus overshadowed by him. But the Grey Eagle had an outstanding 22 year career and ended with a 344 lifetime average, among the five highest in modern baseball. Yet, with that mark, Speaker was only able to sneak into the batting crown but once, in 1919 when he hit .386 with Cleveland. Cobb had won the title five years before that and then three years afterward. Tris hit over 300 19 times. He was also the sport's greatest crowd producer, hitting 793 two-baggers and seven times leading the League. He hit 59 in 1923, when he also led with Speaker but runs batted in with 120. He made fourth-ranked Cobb, Stan Musial and Cap Anson—his lifetime hits with 3,515. As a fielder, he might have been the greatest ever. He was the first man to play a shallow center and was often referred to as the fifth infielder, but he back-pedaled so rapidly that hardly a ball dropped behind him, and while chasing a ball, he gripped over the ground like an eagle. Speaker's last year was 1928, with the Athletics. By coincidence, the right fielder on that team was Mr. Ty Cobb. Tris was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1937.

**TYRUS RAYMOND COBB**  
LEFT FIELDER



No player was capable of winning a game in more ways than the Georgia Peach. In his 24 years, Ty dominated the sport and retired with a .367 lifetime average, the highest in history. His will to win was so fierce he was the most feared player on the diamond. He joined Detroit in 1905 and went to the Philadelphia Athletics in 1926, retiring in 1928. Ty batted lefty and threw righty. He was born in Banks County, Ga., Dec. 18, 1886 and died July 17, 1961.

Three weeks after his father was shot and killed by Ty's own mother in a tragic gun accident in 1905, Ty Cobb broke into the majors with Detroit as an 18-year-old rookie. Standing 5-11 and weighing 160, the Tigers purchased his contract for only \$750 from Augusta and paid him \$1,800 the first year. Ty started in center field in the very first big league game he ever saw. When he walked up to the plate the first time, Detroit fans scanned their scorecards to find out who he was. A murmur fell over the crowd. His name was not even listed. Facing Jack Chesbro, the original spitballer who had won a record 41 games for New York in 1904, Cobb merely doubled over the head of Eddie Hahn in center field, driving in a run from second, to start Detroit on the way to a 5-3 victory. On his next time at bat, Ty drew a walk and was thrown out trying to steal.

Cobb, who stole a total of 892 bases in his big league career, was a snarling, slashing base-runner. Here, against the Red Sox in 1908, he is shown skillfully kicking the ball out of Lou Criger's mitt. Ty was not exceptionally fast. His best time in the 100-yard dash was 10.1 seconds. He said he looked faster than he really was because he got a good jump. He told Mickey Cochrane, the great catcher, that once he got a jump on the pitcher not even the greatest of catchers could throw him out at second, regardless of how strong and accurate his arm was. Cochrane agreed. "It was almost impossible to stop Cobb from scoring." Mickey once told author John McCallum. "All he needed was four inches of the plate." With incredibly fine intuition, Ty claimed he could tell to the second what his opponents would do on almost every pitch.

One of Ring Lardner's favorite stories was about the rookie pitcher who asked his manager for some advice on how to keep Ty Cobb off the bases. The manager said it was easy. Easy? "Sure," the manager told the youngster. "Just get a gun and shoot him."

One of the greatest baseball action photos ever captured by a camera was this one taken in 1909 of Cobb slashing into third base at the finish of a swirling hook slide against New York. The man who took it was old Charley Conlon, a proofreader on the old New York *Telegram* whose hobby was photography. He later confessed that he snapped the picture by accident, didn't even know he had caught Cobb until he got home that night and developed his film in his little darkroom. Curiously, the historic photo was not printed in the *Telegram*. As a matter of fact, it made its first appearance the following January in a baseball guide.

In 1913, Ty Cobb was offered \$100,000 and a three-year contract to jump to an "outlaw" organization calling itself the Federal League. Cobb said no. For his loyalty, Tiger Owner Frank Navin, left, whom Cobb often fought fiercely with at contract-signing time, increased Ty's Detroit salary to \$20,000 in 1915; it went up to \$35,000 in 1920, and finally to \$50,000 when Cobb signed on as player-manager in 1921. Ty earned his salary, too. The years 1913-1919 saw him win the American League batting crown six of seven times. He was also the periodic leader in stolen bases, hits, and runs. Of the 13 records he treasured most, seven of them were made in 1911: batting (.420), runs (147), hits (248), doubles (47), triples (24), runs batted in (144) and slugging percentage (.621).

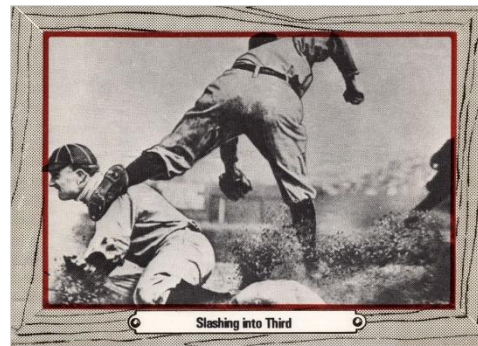

Because of the war in Europe, Ty Cobb played in only 111 games in 1918 but got in enough times at bat (421) to win his 11th batting title with a .382 average. Then, along with other sports stars, he enlisted in the military service. Ty chose the Chemical Warfare Service, where he was given a crash course in defense against and the use of poisonous gas, and was commissioned a captain. He was then shipped to France as an instructor with the "Gas and Flame" Division. George Sisler, Branch Rickey and Christy Mathewson belonged to the same unit. Other than a shell fragment that narrowly missed his left eye, the war presented Cobb with little danger. After the Armistice he was on the first ship to the States to rejoin his family and then the Detroit Tigers in early Summer, 1919. Ty was nearly 33 years old, yet batted .384 in 124 games to win his 12th and final batting championship.

One of the greatest pitcher-batter duels of all time was Walter Johnson (left) vs. Ty Cobb. In a total of 67 big league games, Cobb batted against Johnson 245 times. His .335 percentage included 82 singles, 14 doubles, three triples and a home run. They first faced each other in 1907. When Ty finally figured Walter's pitching style out, the big righthander could be heard muttering to himself, "Gee whilkinks!" Sometimes a Cobb hit drew anger from him, and he'd whisper, "Goodness gracious!" When Cobb made him really mad, he would say, "Goodness gracious, animal!" That was the closest Walter Johnson ever came to swearing. Whenever Ty came to bat, Walter always bore down extra hard. There was nothing he loved more than to stop the great Cobb.

The Cobbian Era started giving way to the Ruthian Era in 1919. Babe Ruth, left, was no longer merely a fine left-handed pitcher — he was fast becoming the mightiest slugger in the history of baseball. The moguls had to have something to take the place of Cobb's scientific baseball to keep those turnstiles clicking. A new act! So they invented the livelier ball to make the hits, the Great Bambino's home runs, more exciting to the fans. Cobb had to ask himself, where is the hit-and-run, the dragged bunt, the squeeze, the delayed steal? Where is the fielding pitcher, the battle of wits? Except for Cobb and a few other veterans, they were gone. All gone. The new game was all power. "I guess more people would rather see Babe hit one over the fence than see me steal second," Cobb said in 1920. He was right, of course.

**TY COBB DATA:** Born December 18, 1886, at Narrows, Bank County, Georgia; died July 17, 1961, Atlanta. Height 6'4", weight 175. Batted left, threw right. Began pro career in 1904, Augusta, South Atlantic League; sold to Detroit Tigers, 1905, hit .240 in 41 games, never hit below .300 in next 23 seasons. During years 1907-1919, led American League in batting every season except 1916; hit .420 in 1911, and .410 in 1912. Topped the AL outfielders in 1924 in fielding percentage, made most putouts in 1911, and assists in 1908; had 30 assists in 1907. Played 3,033 games in 24 years. Most times five hits in one game, season — 4 (1922); six base hits in six times at bat, May 5, 1925; set major league record with most total bases, league — 5,863. Appeared in three World Series (1907, '08, '09), hit .262 in 17 games. Managed Detroit Tigers 1921-26, then went to Philadelphia A's; retired 1928. First man elected to Baseball Hall of 1936, with 222 votes out of possible 226.

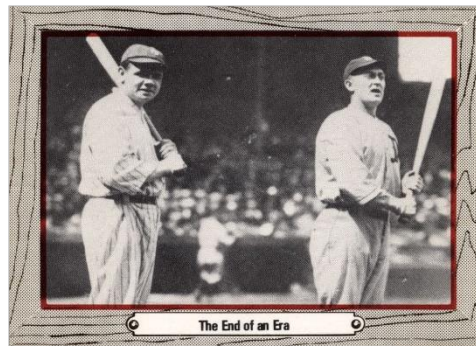

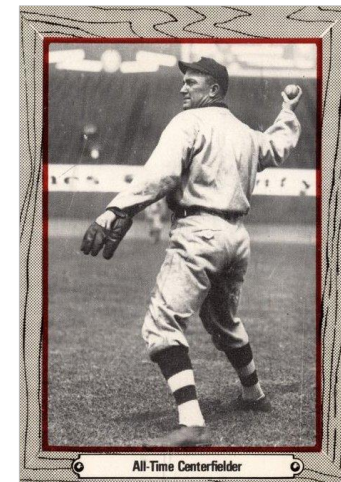

In the Fall and Winter, Ty Cobb exchanged his ball bat for a shotgun to stay in shape. An avid hunter, he was an excellent shot. His two regular hunting partners were from Augusta: Dr. E.M. Wilder, an authority on dogs, and Tom Pilcher, who owned a great kennel of setters. Ty, himself, had a champion Gordon setter named "Hoke." He was as proud of "Hoke" as he was of his batting average. Ty was a much better shot at live birds than at trap shoots. He also liked hunting big game. The walls in his home were covered with prizes he had killed: bear skins, tanned deer hides, and mounted wild mountain goat heads. He prided himself in being able to take young fellows out and "walk 'em down." He hunted for birds on horseback, trailed fox at night, and dropped deer with his rifle from a moving speedboat.

Ty Cobb played in the big leagues for 24 years — 22 with the Tigers and two with the A's. Playing in 3,033 games, he made 4,191 hits and scored 2,244 runs. His closest rival in hits, Tris Speaker, was 676 behind him. Babe Ruth scored 70 fewer runs than Cobb. Ty's lifetime batting average of .367 will probably never be broken. Three times in his career he finished the season with an average above .400. He won the American League batting crown 12 out of 13 years. In 1909, he even finished first in home runs (9). His average was .323 in 1928, his last year of baseball, when he was nearly 42 years old. He stole a career total of 892 bases — 96 in 1915, which remained a single-season record until Maury Wills broke it in 1962 with 104. However, Cobb still holds the all-time record for the most times stealing home with 32.

Ty so dominated the Cobb name that few baseball historians even remember that his younger brother Paul was also a professional ballplayer. Paul Cobb stood 6 feet, weighed 168, and was right-handed all the way. Once the property of the St. Louis Browns, he spent the years 1907-16 in the minors with such leagues as the Western Association, South Michigan League, Eastern League, Union Association, Three I League, Virginia League, and South Atlantic League. In four of the 10 seasons Paul was in organized baseball, he batted above .300: .310 at Lincoln, Nebraska (1910); .306 at Lincoln (1911); .333 at Ogden, Utah (1913); and .331 at Ogden (1914). An alumnus of the Institute of Technology in Georgia, Paul went to war in 1918 and never returned to baseball, much to brother Ty's consternation. This photo was taken in 1927, the year Ty joined the Philadelphia A's. That's Paul on the right.

Ty Cobb always moved among lofty circles. He became acquainted with several Presidents on a first-name basis and played a good deal of poker with them. President Woodrow Wilson invited him to the White House one time and said to him, "Baseball is a great game. Ty, I sometimes wish I had gone into it. There are many more worries attached to this job." And Ty said, "Yes, Mr. President, but don't think there aren't worries in my job when we're fighting for a pennant."

One of Ty's biggest admirers was Thomas A. Edison, pictured here (center) in 1927 with him and manager Connie Mack after Ty signed a \$60,000 contract to play for the Athletics. The great inventor was fascinated by Cobb, and when he, Edison, celebrated his 80th birthday, he asked Ty to tour his laboratories with him. After showing Ty some of his experiments with rubber, he said, "Mr. Cobb, you are involved in a very exact science, too."

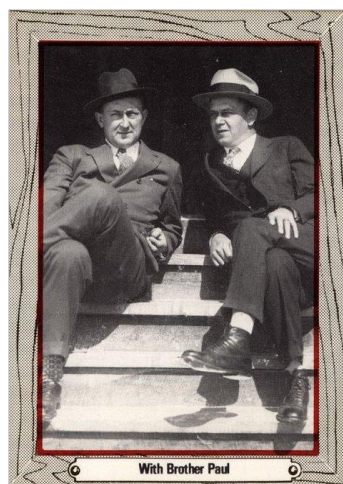

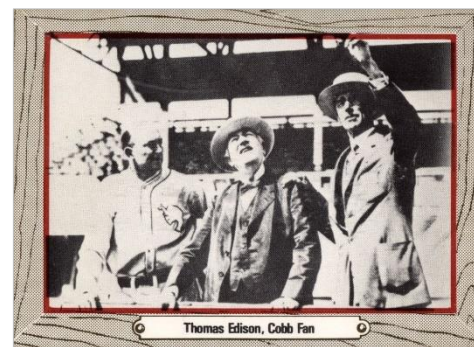

Ty managed to restrain himself, although he did tweak McGraw's nose and snarled, "If you were a younger man, I'd kill you." John J. to his dying day, never forgave Cobb for tweaking his nose. Despite their personal differences, Cobb admired McGraw for his baseball savvy.

Cy Young, whose 511 major league wins top the all-time pitching list, is shown here in 1950, at age 83, telling "Ty Cobb" author John McCallum that the hurlers of his and Cobb's era enjoyed most of the advantages. "The strike zone was wider, the fences longer, the ball deader, and we always pitched a dark ball." Cy said. "We never threw the ball until we had first doctored it; a little tobacco juice and dirt to blacken and liven it up. There were many ways to tamper with it."

Winner of 20 or more games in 16 years, including 30 or more five times, Hall of Famer Young opposed Cobb in a total of 19 games. In 74 times at bat, Ty got 24 hits, including 4 doubles and 3 triples, for a .324 average against Cy.

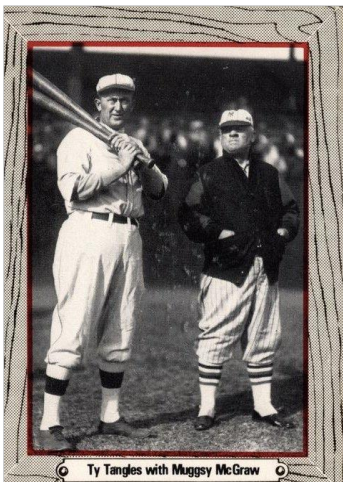

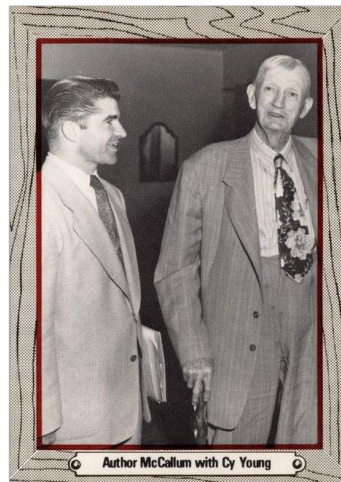

One day the two met in New York before a Yankee-Red Sox game and Ted said he had been wanting to ask Ty a question for a long time. "How do you hit to left field?" he said. Ty told Ted it was only a guess, but he went on to explain how he would hit to left field if he were Ted Williams. Ted seemed to appreciate the advice. 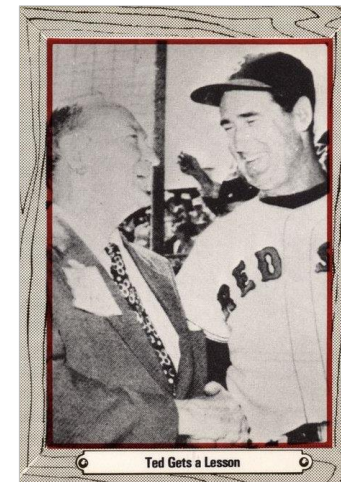

When he was 66, Ty attended a Pacific Coast League ball game in Seattle. Before the game, he went down to the Seattle dugout to say hello to the ballplayers and watch them finish batting practice. Suddenly, someone inside the cage turned to Ty and shouted, "Hey, Ty, wanna hit some?" Ty picked up a bat and took his position at the plate and settled in the classic Cobb stance. He held the bat with hands spread about five inches apart, his feet spread comfortably. Then he went to work. He connected solidly with five pitches in a row. He just met the ball easily, smashing it squarely on the nose. The crowd gave him a standing ovation. It was a rare treat. No one enjoyed that brief moment more than Cobb himself.

Portions of the Ty Cobb story are about as macabre and sordid as any nightmare mind could conjure up. Shown here at the age of 69 in a pensive mood, Cobb told John McCallum, his biographer, that he wasn't going to apologize for his wild ways. "It's too late for that," he said. "But if you want to know the truth, I had to fight all my life to survive. The world was stacked against me. Opponents tried every lousy trick in the book to whip me. But I beat the bastards and left 'em in the ditch." Ty paused, stared out the window just as this photo was snapped, then continued, "I have but one regret, I'll go to my grave regretting that I haven't done any real good for humanity. I suppose I'll be forgotten within a few years." Cobb lived on for nearly five more years. Then, stricken by cancer, he died in Atlanta's Emory University Hospital at 1:20 P.M., July 17, 1961. He left an estate worth millions. He was 74.

He had two chances to break the record, but grounded out in the seventh inning and, after a fairly long 2-hour 3-minute rain delay, struck out in the ninth with the score tied 5-5.



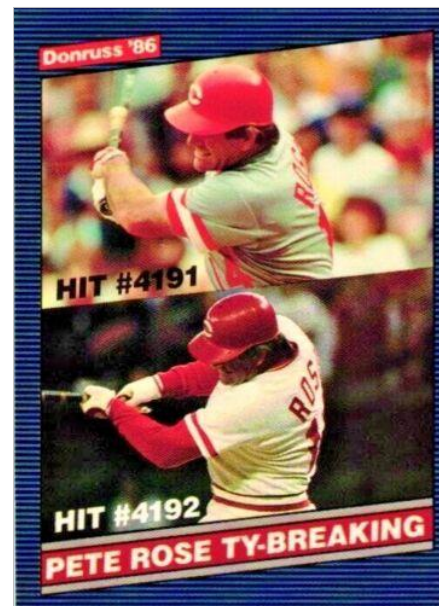

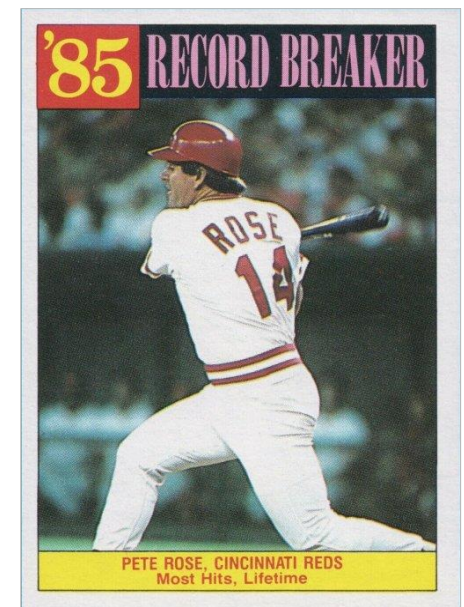

The artwork for this card was created by Gerry Dvorak, an artist who painted many originals used to produce 1953 Topps baseball cards.

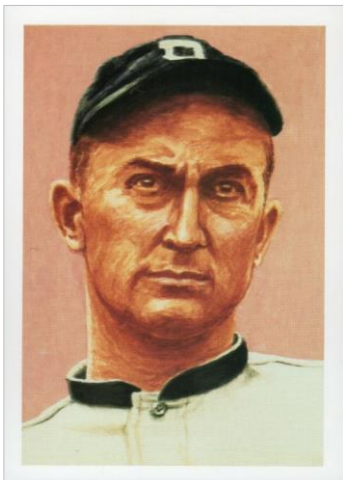
In seven years with Paramount Studios in New York, Dvorak was instrumental in the success of "Popeye" and "Casper" cartoons, among others. He was employed as an animator at Hanna-Barbera, where he animated the prime-time TV series "The Flintstones," "Yogi Bear," "Superman" and "Wonder Woman." He also spent time working on the "Mr. Magoo" series with U.P.A. While working as an animator, Dvorak also painted the original artwork for many of the 1953 Topps baseball cards.

His original of Mickey Mantle was purchased by Marriott at auction for \$121,000 in 1992.

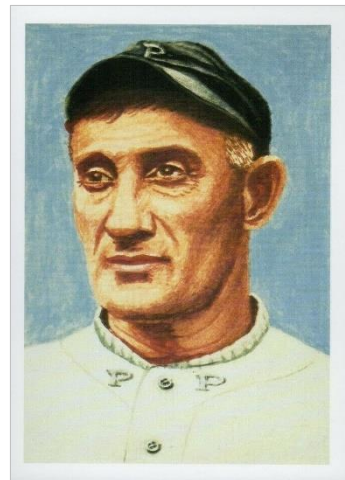
Dvorak became a celebrity on the sports collectible circuit and was featured on Mel Allen's "This Week in Baseball" TV show, as well as in numerous industry publications such as Sports Collectors Digest, Baseball Cards Magazine, Baseball Hobby News and Legends Sports Memorabilia. He was commissioned to paint dozens of portraits of celebrity athletes, many of whom autographed the works. He collaborated with Mickey Mantle, Eric Davis and other baseball players to produce limited-edition lithographs.

Over the years our hobby has been privileged to be affiliated with people who were part of the creative process leading up to and including the production of trading cards and others collectibles. One such man was Gerry Dvorak who painted portraits of many ballplayers which Topps included in their 1953 baseball trading card set.

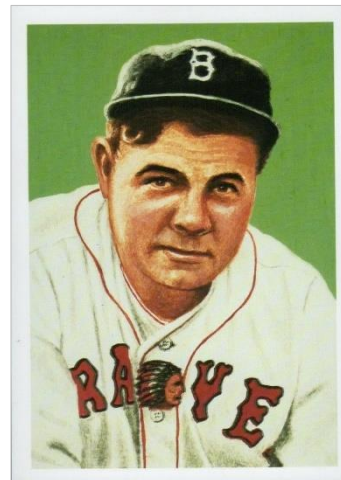


When a sports writer asked Hall of Famer Joe Sewell who was the best player he ever saw he said: "Cobb, without a question, because he could beat you so many ways ... Cobb could do everything."

Three qualities separated Cobb from all other players of his era. These were: his intense, almost maniacal will to win; his brilliant mind; and his unmatched dedication to master every facet of the game.

Cobb was a genius. He would outsmart the opposition as often as outplay them. He observed and studied his opponents — always searching for something new to learn or a flaw he could exploit later.

The "Georgia Peach" worked and practiced until he had no weaknesses. He held the bat in his own unique way, with hands apart — one down near the knob, the other higher up the handle. His only goal was to get on base. If the pitcher had good stuff Cobb would move the bottom hand up and slap the ball through the infield for a single. If he detected a weakness he would slide the top hand down and swing away.

Once on base Cobb was unstoppable. He was the greatest player of his time.



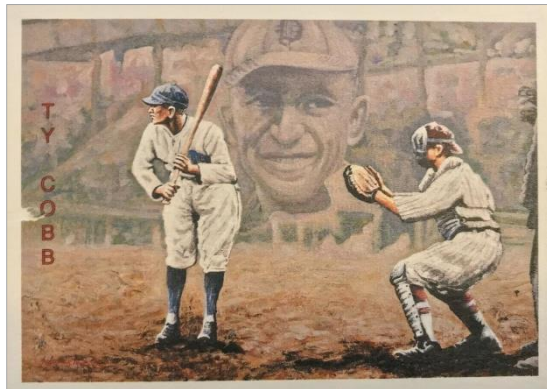
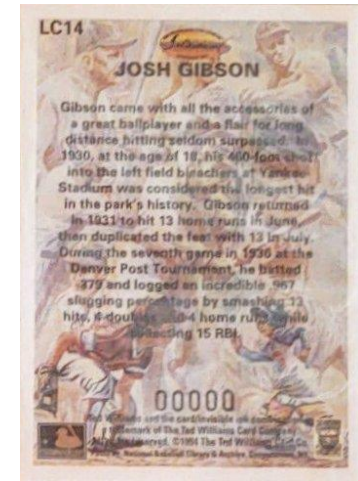
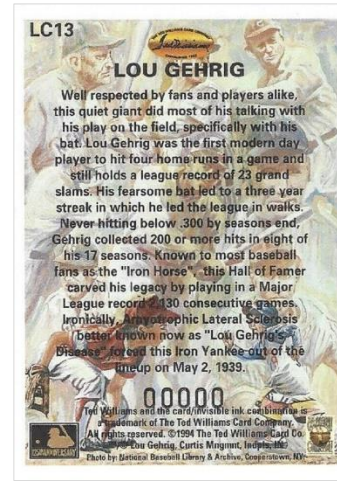
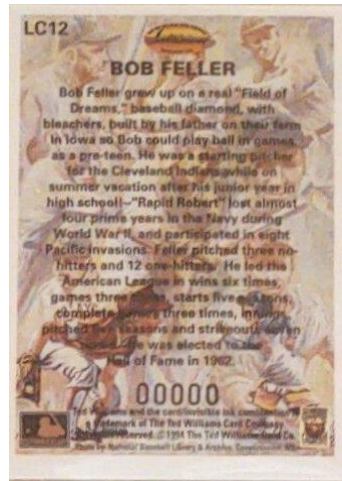
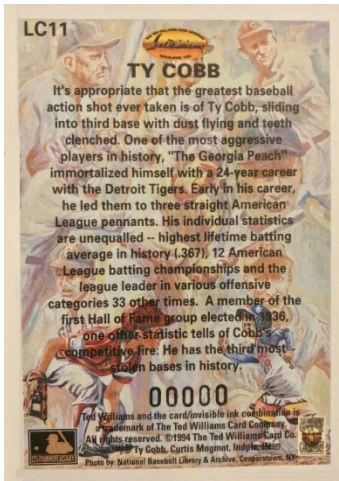

## 1963 - 1967 Sport Hobbyist Famous Card Series

Frank Nagy was raised in Detroit and as a youngster he would sneak off into Briggs Stadium to watch his beloved Detroit Tigers. He also collected baseball cards and by the early 1950's he had amassed thousands of cards going back into the 1930's.

In 1959, he completed one of the most historic deals in card collecting by acquiring the enormous 300,000 card collection of Walter Corson that went back to the 1880's and included 18 full sets of the famous 1952 Topps cards all in uncirculated condition.

In the mid-60s, as an advanced collector and sometimes-dealer Nagy would publish one of the first collecting magazines, The Sport Hobbyist.

The Hobbyist printed 6 cards per year from 1963 to 1967, for a complete set of 30, including several E-series candy cards, a handful of rarely seen Tango Eggs, and the first known reprint of the famous T206 Honus Wagner. These pulled double duty as Frank Nagy's business cards. The card backs included both vintage set details and his Sport Hobbyist business address.

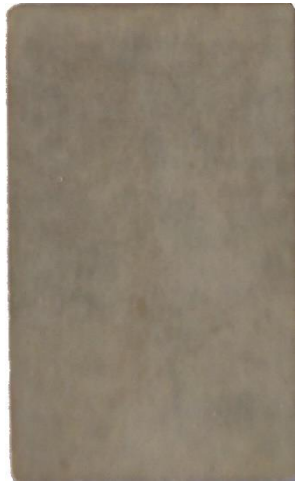

In one of the most spectacular hitting performances in the history of baseball, Ty Cobb at the age of 38, proved his uncanny ability to control his batting prowess and hit home runs at will.

Not only was the athletic feat itself astonishing, but the fact that Cobb predicted his own performance might be most noteworthy. After being constantly criticized by reporters for his inability to hit the long ball, like players such as Ruth and Gehrig, he decided to show the reporters that he could do just that.

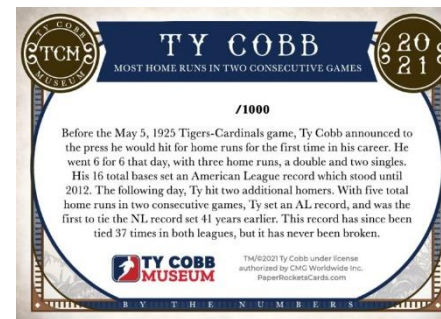
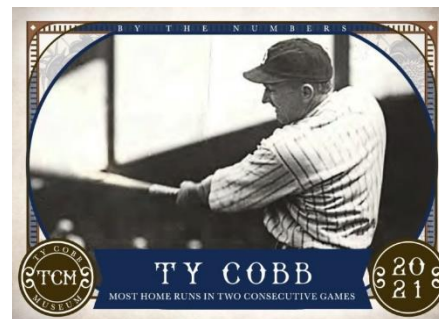
While talking to a reporter in the dugout before the start of the game on May 5th, he stated: "I'll show you something today. I'm going for home runs for the first time in my career."

Cobb stood by his words. He hit five home runs in two consecutive days, a performance which has been equaled, but never surpassed. On May 5th, he started his historical push by going six for six at the plate with three home runs, a double and two singles. The following day he continued his barrage of nine consecutive hits going three for six with two more home runs for a total of 25 bases in just two games.

## 2009 Topps “Ty Cobb” Sketch Card

Sketch cards have existed since sometime in the 1990s being picked up by trading card companies in the early 2000s. Many collectors don't even know what a sketch card is and those that do value them for the art quality and the specific artist creating the artwork.

Such cards are simply the creation of a *one-of-a-kind original piece of artwork* hand designed and signed by the artist and licensed by the card company.

Originally and still known outside the trading card company domain as ACEOs (Artist Cards, Editions and Originals) or ATCs (Art Trading Cards) the inclusion within trading card packs has substantially elevated the artwork and artists.

Sketch cards range from standard 2"x3" to larger 3.5"x5" size illustrations.

As uniquely rare 1/1 artwork some sketch cards can be extremely valuable.

The greatest player of the "dead ball era" — if not all eras — Ty was a ferocious competitor who spent 22 of his 24 seasons with the Tigers before finishing up with the Philadelphia Athletics. He used his trademark spread-hands grip to win a record 11 AL batting titles and fashion a .366 career average — still the highest of all time. "The Georgia Peach" collected more hits (4,189) than anyone but Pete Rose, and more stolen bases than all but Rickey Henderson and Lou Brock. Cobb won a Triple Crown in 1909 (.377-9-107) and received the first Chalmers Award (akin to the MVP) two years later when he swatted .420.

Ty was one of the greatest players and fiercest competitors in history. Nicknamed the "Georgia Peach," he doubled in his first Major League at-bat, hit .320 as a 19-year-old and never batted that low again in a career that spanned more than two decades. Three times, he topped .400. He won an AL Triple Crown in 1909, and took the AL MVP Award two years later. His 12 batting titles with a .367 career average are marks that have never been rivaled. Cobb retired holding some 90 Major League or American League records, including Major League standards for career hits, runs and stolen bases.

Ty, who compiled the highest career average (.366) in Major League history, first showed off his aggressive style and sweet stroke in Detroit as an 18-year-old in 1905. Two years later, he whacked .350 with 212 hits, 119 RBI and 49 stolen bases — all tops in the American League. Over the next 12 seasons, he would win 10 more batting crowns, pace the circuit in runs scored five times and amass 740 steals. Ty was a unanimous choice for AL MVP honors in '11 after setting lifetime bests in average (.420), doubles (47) and RBI (127). He garnered 98.2 percent of the vote for Hall of Fame inclusion in '36.

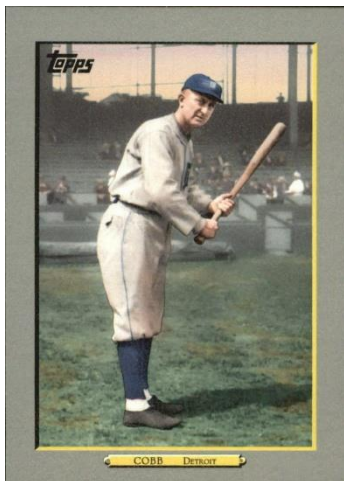

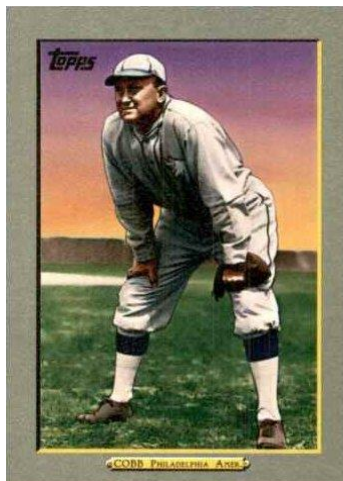
An abhorrence of losing drove Ty to greatness throughout his 24-year, Hall of Fame career. With an aggressive baserunning style and an uncompromising approach in the box, he stacked up a dozen AL batting titles in a 13-year span for the Tigers beginning in 1907. Ty won the AL Triple Crown (.377-9-107) in 1909 while leading Detroit to its third straight appearance in the Fall Classic, and won the initial Chalmers Award (a precursor to the MVP Award) in 1911. His name is scattered throughout the Baseball record books. Ty's .366 career average ranks first all time; his .433 on-base percentage stands ninth; and his hit (4,189) and run (2,245) totals rank second.

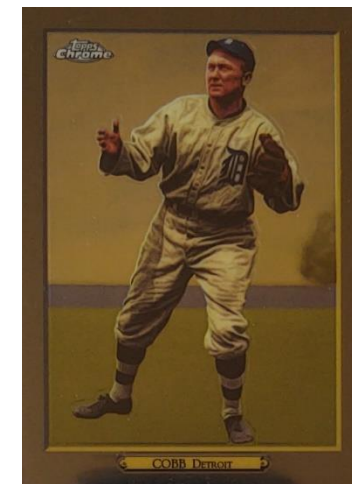
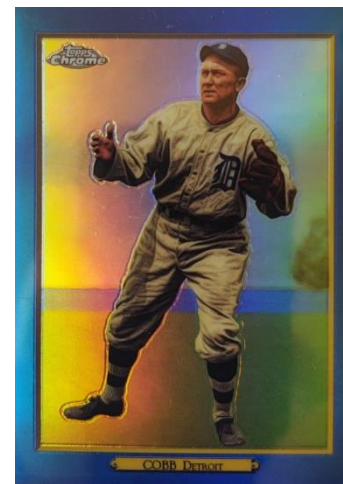
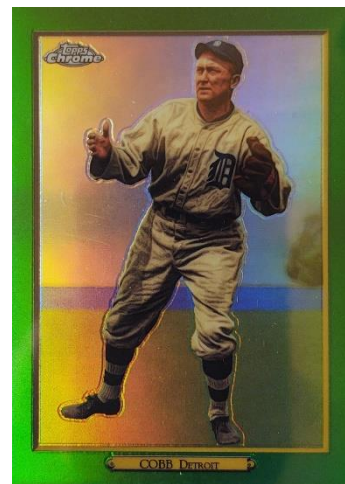
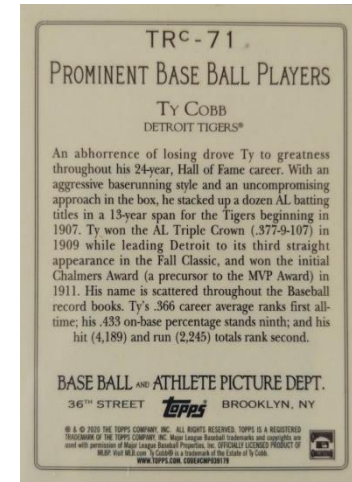
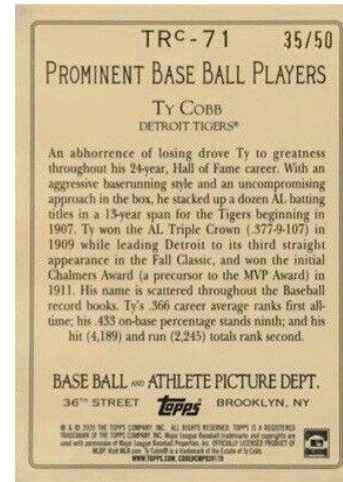
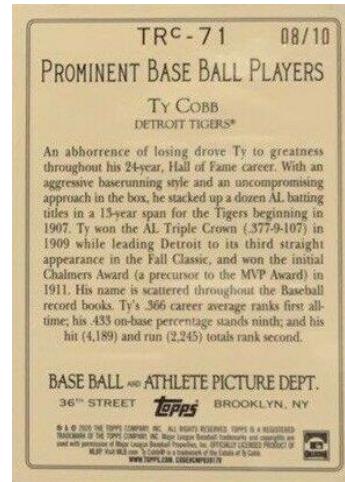
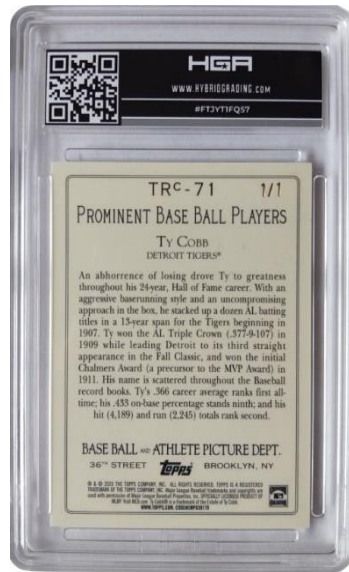
Cobb, nicknamed "The Georgia Peach", was an American Major League Baseball outfielder. Born in rural Narrows, Georgia, he spent 22 seasons with the Detroit Tigers, the last six as the team's player-manager and finished his career with the Philadelphia Athletics. Widely considered the greatest baseball player of all time he set 90 MLB records. Cobb's .367 career batting average is still the highest ever recorded and his 4,189 base hits rank second in major league baseball record books. He and Honus Wagner hold the record of 4 times stealing second base, third base and home in the same inning. Babe Ruth once reflected on how Cobb amazingly performed the almost impossible feat of stealing second, third and home on consecutive pitches.

Cobb won the 1909 AL Triple Crown and was the first of only two players (Carl Yastrzemski) to achieve the Quadruple Crown, league batting average, home runs, RBI's and hits in a season.

The famous Bettman Archives photograph above of Cobb was captured in detail in this 2020 Topps Series 2 Turkey Red Chrome Gold Superfractor, the only card of its kind in the world. This ultra-rare baseball card combined with the green refractor (1 of only 10), blue refractor (1 of only 50) and the Chrome base card fashion the exclusive one-of-a-kind rainbow set.

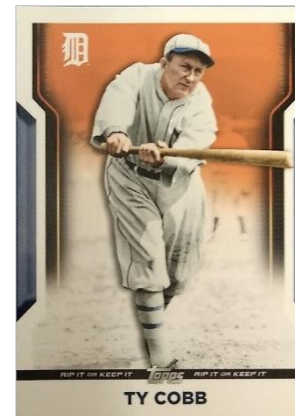
In 2020, Topps introduced the ripped concept that many were familiar with through Allen & Ginter baseball cards. The standard size base and parallel card issues if ripped open would contain within an exclusive mini card including short print image variations and even autographed issues.

Ty Cobb, credited with setting 90 MLB records, was not included as a player selection until the reintroduction of the Topps Ripped Series in 2021.

The Georgia Peach would add the eighth and ninth links to his unbroken chain of American League batting titles during the two seasons this contract represents, securing a record as safe as any in American sports. Though his good buddy Tris Speaker would break the streak in 1916, Cobb would reclaim the throne for the remainder of the Dead Ball Era, recording the last three of a career tally of a dozen between 1917 and 1919.

## “The Shot Heard ‘Round the World” October 3, 1951

Was a game-winning home run by New York Giants third baseman Bobby Thomson off Brooklyn Dodgers pitcher Ralph Branca at the Polo Grounds in New York City on October 3, 1951, to win the National League (NL) pennant.

The classic drama of snatching victory from defeat to secure a pennant was intensified by the epic cross-town rivalry between the Giants and Dodgers and by a remarkable string of victories in the last weeks of the regular season by the Giants, who won 37 of their last 44 games to catch the first-place Dodgers and force a playoff series to decide the NL champion.

The game, *the first televised nationally*, was seen by millions of viewers across America and heard on radio by millions more, including thousands of American servicemen stationed in Korea, listening on Armed Forces Radio.

Thomson had won the first game of a three-game playoff for the pennant with a home run and his dramatic three-run homer came in the ninth inning of the decisive third game in which the Giants trailed, 4–1 entering the ninth, and 4–2 with two runners on base at the time of Thomson's at-bat.

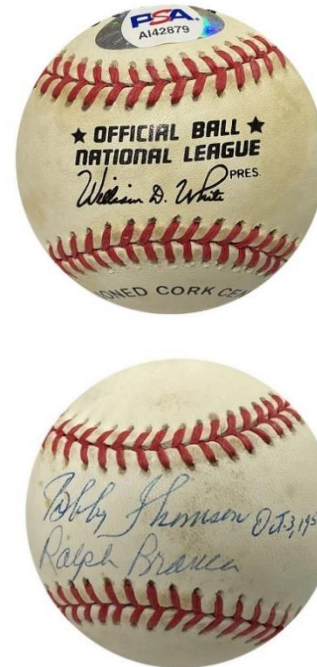

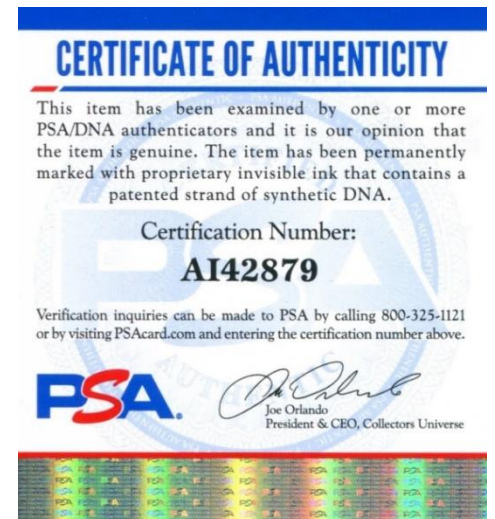

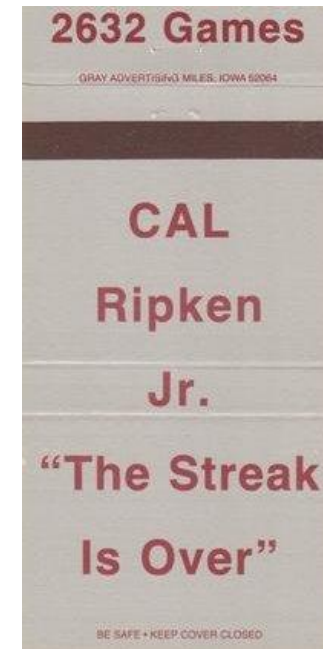

Gehrig’s streak ended on May 2, 1939, as a result of the onset of ALS and his record of 2,030 consecutive games seemed unbreakable: Ripken broke the record and then extended the streak to 2,632 games, making his achievement almost otherworldly.

Ripken received a standing ovation from the crowd, the opposing players, and all four umpires that lasted more than 22 minutes, one of the longest standing ovations in history for any athlete. ESPN, the broadcaster that night televised the entire ovation without commercial break.

Then on September 20, 1998 before the final home game of the season against the New York Yankees at Camden Yards in Baltimore, Maryland, Ripken decided to end his streak at 2,632 games, having surpassed Gehrig’s previous record by 502 games. Ripken compiled 3,184 hits, 431 home runs, and 1,695 runs batted in during his career and won two Gold Glove Awards. He was a 19-time All-Star and was twice named American League (AL) Most Valuable Player (MVP). In 2007, he was elected to the National Baseball Hall of Fame in his first year of eligibility with 98.53% of votes, the sixth-highest election percentage ever.
